POWER OF ONE INCURSION


On Thursday 10th May all of the students at Tyabb Primary School attended a performance called, "The Power of One." This presentation focused on helping students to identify the different types of bullying. The children watched a series of skits presented by actors who used boxes, colours and masks to vividly portray what bullying is, what can be done about it, and how every child has the power of one - the power to report bullying when they see it. The presentation covered the following:

- Explained the roles in bullying: Bully, Target, and Bystander.
- Showed vivid examples of different types of bullying: Physical, Verbal, Exclusion, and Cyber bullying.
- Alerted children that Targets need help and intervention. Bullies also need help to understand the impact of their actions.
- Encouraged students not to be bystanders
- Emphasised the need for individual action to make the community a safer, better place.
- Referred children to parents, adults, and teachers for further assistance and instruction.

The presenters reinforced that **bullying is when someone or a group of people deliberately upset or hurt another person or damage their property, reputation or social acceptance on more than one occasion.**

Ask your child/children to tell you about this performance and what they learnt in relation to bullying. Help to reinforce this message by asking your child - What is bullying? Is it OK to be a bystander? What can you do when you or someone else are being bullied?

At the end of the performance, the students said the oath below as a pledge to stop bullying and keep Tyabb Primary School a safe, friendly and secure learning environment. The school was presented with a poster with the Anti-bullying Oath. This oath will be signed by all students at the school and displayed to remind them of their promise.

EDUCATION WEEK


This week is Education Week in Victorian Schools and we have celebrated at Tyabb Primary School with a number of activities that celebrate The Arts.

PRINCIPAL AWARD

100 AND 200 NIGHTS OF READING

To promote a love for reading and a regular reading routine I am proudly presenting all students who reach both 100 nights and 200 nights of reading with a special Principal certificate and award. Each week students who reach these milestones will be called down to the office to be presented with this award. I have already had 40 students reach 100 nights and look forward to congratulating many more in the coming weeks— hopefully all 408.

We really encourage all students to read most nights and if possible read to a parent or older sibling. Even when students become independent readers at home it is important to regularly check in on their progress and have a conversation about the books read to ensure comprehension and engagement.



Have a look at the bookshelves in your home. If your walls are lined with books, your child is given an enormous advantage in school.

The researchers studied representative families in 27 nations and found a correlation between the number of books in the home and the number of years a child spent in school:

Growing up in a home with 500 books would propel a child 3.2 years further in education, on average, than would growing up in a similar home with few or no books.

Further, the study found that a child from a book-filled home is 19 percent more likely to finish college than a child from a home without books. The overall effect holds from country to country, even adjusting for parent education and other family characteristics. When books are enjoyed at home, the study contends, that translates to school being more enjoyable as well.




We Love Our Mums

At the beginning of the unit, we test all students on a range of skills to see what the students already know.
