

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

ENROLMENTS AND GRADES FOR 2019

Enrolments for 2019 are very strong with 70 new preps and several new students going to other grades. We will begin next year with approximately 420 students which is fabulous. If you will not be returning to Tyabb next year, please let us know as we will soon begin working out grades and this may have an impact on the grade structures we have planned. The earlier we have this information, the better we are able to cater for everyone's needs.

We have already had parents making enquiries as to which teachers will be in certain grades for next year so they can make requests for particular teachers. Please know that it is our policy not to take requests for particular teachers unless there are exceptional circumstances or the student has specific learning or behavioural needs. Such requests should be submitted in writing during November when we are allocating children to grades. Please also note that we do not allocate teachers to grades until early December so don't start asking teachers which grade they will have next year as they will not know at this stage.

The placement of children in grades is a complex task, taking into account the academic and social characteristics of each child, friendship groups and special circumstances. These decisions are well thought out and will not be changed once allocated. I must stress again that once grades have been worked out and students are informed we will be consistent and not make any changes.



Curriculum Corner



In the Music Room Term 4: What a great start to **Term 4** in the music room. It was lovely to see the children after my break away last term and to be greeted with “Welcome back” and “Did you have a good time?” To which I replied “Thank you and yes I certainly did.” Many thanks to Miss Ashkenazi who took music so well. She enjoyed her time in music taking the opportunity to further her teaching skills and gain some insight into the field of music.



Prep A and B have music this semester and this term they are exploring all about high and low sounds called Pitch. They have listened to outside sounds and percussion instruments, practised using their singing voice, played chime bars and moved to music with high and low features. They are very enthusiastic and one of their favourite activities is Giants and Fairies where they can express themselves in movement to the highness and lowness of the music. They also love playing the variety of percussion especially the drums to represent characters as in The Three Bears.

Grades 1 and 2 are also exploring the concept of Pitch and Melody. They have been learning some singing games which assist with pitch, teamwork and improve their auditory skills, i.e. listening better. They have played chime bars, tuned percussion and keyboards to find notes and play simple melodic patterns with a song or on its own. They have been introduced to graphic notation, (soundshapes) so they can explore the contour of the music. They have begun an Ipad app called Mussila which builds music skills and their focus is on the melody section.



Music is part of the **Grades 5 and 6 Electives** program on Wednesdays. This term we have Music Futures Rock Band and Ipad in the Music Classroom. So far Rock Band have had specific lessons on keyboard, guitar and drums. They will be choosing the instrument they feel most capable on and playing modern songs as a group over the coming weeks. The Ipad group have focused on Garageband and worked on a different project each week. ‘What’s in a Name’, ‘Soundscapes’ ‘Rockstar Drummer’ and ‘DIY Soundtrack’. Both groups are enthusiastic and enjoying their learning in elective time.



The **school band and choir** are working towards a visit to two Elderly residences late in November. We will have a day out to perform for some of our senior citizens who always enjoy seeing and hearing from the children. We are practising every week and look forward to this community service. **Carols by Candlelight** in Somerville will be on Friday December 14th. Choir members have begun some carols and I will be calling for any children in grades 2 -6 who wish to sing with us there in the coming weeks.

ANXIETY

As we approach the end of the school year, some students may be starting to think about their next year. This may result in raised levels of anxiety with some children. At Tyabb we provide all students with an Internal Transition program which gives them the opportunity to meet their teacher for 2019 and to find out which room they will be in and which peers will be with them. These sessions will take place this year on Tuesday 4th December and Tuesday 11th December. This program has been operating for a number of years and we have found it to be beneficial to all of the students. Below is an outline of the different ways anxiety can be presented in children. If you feel that your child has heightened levels of anxiety, please do not hesitate to contact Kris Grinsted at the school.

ANXIETY PRESENTS ITSELF IN MANY DIFFERENT WAYS

- Agitation
- Restlessness
- Inattention, poor focus
- Somatic symptoms like headaches or stomach aches
- Avoidance
- Tantrums
- Crying
- Refusing to go to school
- Meltdowns before school about clothing, hair, shoes, socks
- Meltdowns after school about homework
- Difficulties with transitions within school, and between school and an activity/sport
- Difficulty settling down for bed
- Having high expectations for school work, homework and sports performance

If you feel that your child would benefit from the services of a psychologist, please do not hesitate to make contact with Kris Grinsted (Acting Assistant Principal). Our visiting psychologist has been very beneficial to a range of students throughout the year.
