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PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Reminder

2019 IS OUR YEAR OF REVIEW

As part of the Department of Education's commitment to continuous improvement and providing the best possible education for our students, each Victorian government school undertakes a formal review every four years. Our review will take place in term 4.

In preparation for this we are currently completing a comprehensive self-evaluation which will involve gathering feedback from students, teachers and community members. The focus of this assessment and school reflection is to help identify:

- what is working well
- what needs to continue
- which areas of the school's work may need to be improved or further developed.

An independent reviewer will analyse our school's performance against the goals and targets in our last four year strategic plan. They will reflect on the feedback we receive from the community and support us in setting our new goals for our new four-year school strategic plan.

We are seeking your help and feedback. Some of this feedback will come from formal assessments such as NAPLAN and our staff, student and parent opinion surveys. We will also be sending out a link to all families to complete a short survey monkey. All of this information will help us to make improvements to provide the best possible education for your children. Please note that you can give us feedback at any time using the feedback tab on Flexibuzz.


ATTITUDES TO SCHOOL SURVEY



Each year our students in years 4, 5 and 6 complete an online survey to tell us how they feel about their experience at school. This survey provides us with valuable data on our students' views of their wellbeing, engagement, learning and relationships with teachers and peers. We analyse these results and use the information to reflect on our performance, identify areas for improvement and plan programs and activities to improve your child's experience at school.

As displayed in the tables below our overall results are extremely positive (coloured bars on the graph), showing that students are engaged and have a positive attitude towards most aspects of their schooling. Over 80% of students gave positive feedback in most areas. These results are a credit to all of our staff who have worked with our students over the years but especially our year 4, 5 & 6 team and our specialist teachers. It is also a credit to the students themselves - we are so lucky to have such wonderful students and a supportive school community!

Whilst we celebrate the positives, we also look for areas for improvement. Teachers will analyse these results and the more detailed reports we receive in the following weeks to set goals for the rest of this year and for 2020. These results will also be used during our formal review process.





Welfare

SPECIAL ASSEMBLIES

You may have heard from your children that last week we had two special assemblies, held at the beginning of lunchtime on both Tuesday and Wednesday. The reason for these assemblies was to address a few issues and send the same message out to all of the students. As Welfare coordinator it is my role to ensure the safety of all students in our school and manage any issues that occur. Over the past few weeks it has come to my attention that the following issues needed to be addressed.

1. Road Safety

The Crossing Supervisor has reported that some of our students who are riding and/or walking to school are not using the crossing correctly. This includes crossing at the roundabout rather than making their way to the supervised crossing on Boes Road. This is extremely dangerous during the busy pick up and drop off times. Yes, it may be a bit of a walk to the crossing, but the road rules stipulate that crossings must be used when the flags are on display and the crossing is supervised.

2. Using sticks inappropriately

We are very fortunate to work and learn in such a lovely natural environment each day. However, having a range of trees leads to quite a number of sticks/branches dropping to the ground. Some of our students are utilising these for digging implements, however there have been other times when these sticks have been used inappropriately, resulting in students being scratched and/or hurt by others making poor choices. Students were told that they were NOT to pick up or use sticks in any way due to the poor choices that have been made.

3. 'Hands Off'

The students that attend Tyabb Primary school are very kind and caring. However, there are times when games get out of hand and there is rough play that takes place. Tyabb Primary School does not

allow students to tackle when playing football and this is a rule well known by the students. We also encourage students to keep their 'hands off' other students as we have zero tolerance to inappropriate physical contact – hitting, kicking and pushing.

4. Arriving late to class after recess/ lunch breaks

At the end of both recess and lunch there is music played for approximately 3 minutes followed by the bell. Students know and are encouraged to be standing in line outside their classroom by the time the bell has rung. There are some students who are ignoring the music and then wandering to their classrooms when they hear the bell ring. It is expected that students start to make a move towards their classroom and/or specialist when the music plays so that they can receive their full amount of time in the classroom and learning is not impacted.

5. Indecent language

Unfortunately in our society children can be exposed to a range of indecent language, and as parents there are times it is difficult to monitor this 100%. However, even if children are exposed to this type of language it is very important that they know that school is NOT the place for this language to be used. This generally applies to our middle and senior year levels. If younger students hear this language they

are going to repeat it, often being unaware of the offensiveness. It is an expectation that students do not use indecent language at our school.

I would appreciate you, as parents, following up on these issues and discussing them with your child/children in light of supporting our values and discipline at Tyabb Primary School.

PLEASE NOTE; Due to safety restrictions set by the venue, children over 12 months of age must have their own seat.

When the tickets go on sale, you will have a choice of selecting your own seats. We ask that you **DO NOT LEAVE** any vacant seats in between bookings. Parents in a split family situation are strongly encouraged to communicate between both parties to ensure only **THREE** tickets per performance are purchased. Failure to follow this process could result in tickets being reallocated or cancelled.

Floor seating is available in rows AA-EE (there are no stairs to navigate).

Two wheelchair spaces have been allocated and there are 2 seats next to each space to allow families to sit together. Please contact the school ASAP to reserve the wheelchair spaces and the adjoining seats. If these seats are not booked by Wednesday 11th September, they will be opened up for general seating.

In the event that not all families take up their full offer of three tickets per performance, we will open ticket sales for unlimited / additional purchases on Wednesday 11th September. You will be notified via **FlexiBuzz** should more tickets become available.

NATIONAL SCIENCE

This year, the theme for National Science Week (10th-17th August) is 'Destination Moon: more missions, more science'. It focuses on the combination of scientists, engineers, mathematicians, flight directors, aerospace technicians ,and the technologies they used, that contributed to the success of the NASA Apollo 11 mission, 50 years ago. The celebration of this momentous achievement extends to further space technologies and designs that have made further missions into space and also future capabilities that are being prototyped today.

During this week, the students at Tyabb have continued to enjoy all sorts of science discoveries. Preps did a scavenger hunt to look for everyday materials that they could find around our school. Grade two children looked at the properties of materials and investigated how far they could stretch lolly snakes. The grade 3 and 4 students observed the effect of heat on solids and learnt about reversible and irreversible changes to matter.

As well as our weekly science lessons, we also ran some lunch-time classes this week to engage the children in science using hands on activities. There was a lot of enthusiasm towards our 'Slime making' lab this week, particularly from our keen junior scientists. We hope to extend this activity in to next week to accommodate those disappointed students who missed out on Wednesday's session.

Grade 4-6 students had a chance to explore our fantastic Lego Wedo kits. This is such an amazing resource for those interested in beginner robotics and simple drag and drop programming.



There were many students new to this but they soon managed to get the hang of it. They built projects such as moon rovers, cars and robotic arms.



The Preps were super excited to make 'Moon Dough' in honour of the Science Week theme this year. They enjoyed this simple yet fun sensory experience and were extremely helpful in packing up the mess at the end of the session.



A big thank you to my Science Captains for helping me to organise the sessions and for assisting students on the day. Also, thank you to all of the students who participated in the sessions this week. It's wonderful to see so many budding scientists at Tyabb Primary School. Your curiosity and enthusiasm for Science is so inspiring. Don't forget to drag your family along and check out some of the wonderful Science Week activities, talks and movie screenings being held on the Mornington Peninsula this week, particularly @Mornington library.

CHEAP CAT DESEXING - \$20 for male cats, \$50 for female cats.

OPTIONAL- \$35 microchip. Microchips can be done on their own providing you have a health care/pension card. For example, if you wish to have your male cat desexed and microchipped it will cost you \$55, or for a female it will be \$85.

A program, for financially disadvantaged residents of Mornington Peninsula has been set up to have cats desexed at the above rates. This has been funded by an Animal Welfare Society, not the council. To be eligible for this program you need to hold a health care card or a pension card and live in the Mornington Peninsula Shire.

To take advantage of this offer please contact Julie on 5156 1296 or 0423 682 158 Mon-Frid 10am-12pm & 4-6pm & Sunday 10am-1pm ONLY. Alternatively you can text your name and phone number to Julie's mobile and she will call you back. Julie will send you a desexing voucher and then you need to ring either Rye Veterinary Clinic on 5985 6644 (2261 Point Nepean Rd, Rye) or Mt Eliza Village Vet on 5955 2440 (85 Canadian Bay Rd, Mt Eliza) to book your cat in, and state you have a desexing voucher. Please also advise them if you wish to have a microchip done as well. When bringing your cat into the clinic please provide the voucher, show health care/pension card, photo identification and pay either \$20 or \$50 at admission time. If you are also getting your cat microchipped, then you will need to pay the extra \$35 at time of admission. For kittens to be desexed they need to weigh 1 kilo or more.

Please take a screen shot of this post so that you have all the information at hand. We are very grateful to the animal charity, the volunteers, and the Rye and Mt Eliza vet clinics for providing this service.

Some councils, such as Frankston & Dandenong provide desexing vouchers for dogs/cats to health care/pension card holders, so please ring your council to find out if they offer this service. PLS SHARE.


