Week two: 6B, 6A, 4A, 4B, 2A


Week three: 3B, 3A, 4B

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT TO ARRIVE ON TIME?



A very BIG THANKYOU to the parents who are ensuring that their children arrive on time to school ready to learn.

What impact does being late have on the student?

Students who are late miss a lot of instructions and information about what is happening, not to mention important learning sessions. This means that they have to catch up somehow. Students also miss out on catching up with their friends in the playground before school. Students can feel unsettled, disorganised and unhappy for the rest of the day and it can take them some time to complete and understand the work that they have missed. It's similar to being late to see a movie and not being able to understand what's happening because you have missed out on who the characters are and what the plot is.

How does it affect the other students in the class?

Students who are late have an unsettling effect on the rest of the class. Because not all late students arrive at once, the interruptions go on until the last student is settled. Students who are late often have things that need to be done prior to them joining the class and this causes even more disruption. Sometimes other students have to wait to get the teacher's attention and important issues can be forgotten.

A student who is half an hour late each day misses the equivalent of 16.6 days of learning each year.

PLEASE NOTE; Due to safety restrictions set by the venue, children over 12 months of age must have their own seat.

When the tickets go on sale, you will have a choice of selecting your own seats. We ask that you **DO NOT LEAVE** any vacant seats in between bookings. Parents in a split family situation are strongly encouraged to communicate between both parties to ensure only **THREE** tickets per performance are purchased. Failure to follow this process could result in tickets being reallocated or cancelled.

Floor seating is available in rows AA-EE (there are no stairs to navigate).

Two wheelchair spaces have been allocated and there are 2 seats next to each space to allow families to sit together. Please contact the school ASAP to reserve the wheelchair spaces and the adjoining seats. If these seats are not booked by Wednesday 11th September, they will be opened up for general seating.

In the event that not all families take up their full offer of three tickets per performance, we will open ticket sales for unlimited / additional purchases on Wednesday 11th September. You will be notified via **FlexiBuzz** should more tickets become available.

Concert Notice – Last minute details

Dear Parents,

This is a reminder that our school production is on Monday 16th September and Tuesday 17th September, 2019. The excitement is building with staff and students' busy learning their dance moves and preparing for their item. It is shaping up to be another wonderful concert. The concert is run over two nights to allow more parents to watch and purchase tickets. Your child will perform the same dance routine/concert item twice. One night at 6pm and on the other night at 8pm depending on their grouping (Group A or Group B).

Here are some important details to assist with the arrangements on the days of the performance.

<u>Arrival Time</u>: We ask that students arrive 30 minutes before each performance so that they can be marked off, dressed in the appropriate costume as instructed by their classroom teacher and ready for the start of the concert.

(5:30 pm drop off for the 6:00 pm performance, 7:30 pm drop off for the 8:00 pm performance.) Leads please come earlier - at 5:00 pm speaking roles - 5.15 pm non- speaking roles.

<u>Drop Off</u>: For students in grades prep, 1, 2, 3, 4 the drop off is at the Elizabeth Murdoch Centre on the left hand side of the basketball centre, around the back of the theatre. There will be a sign and a teacher to direct you. All grade 5s to enter via the main entry to the basketball centre and go to the glass panelled room in the foyer

(A grade 5 teacher will be at the door to mark students off). All grade 6s, including leads, are to enter via the stage door (a grade 6 teacher will be at the door to mark students off).

Parents with tickets are then asked to wait in the basketball foyer and/or nearby outdoor areas until auditorium doors open. The Langwarrin Performing Arts Centre is a small theatre with labelled seats, there will be 2 parents as ushers to help you find your chairs.

What to bring: Children can bring a small back pack with a water bottle that is clearly named (no sweet drinks or juices). They can bring something small to do during the performance (while they wait to go on stage) e.g. colouring book and pencils, cards, reading book etc.

Note: Leads are to refer to their specific notice for details pertaining to them.

** NO MOBILE PHONES or ELECTRONIC DEVICES permitted back stage**

<u>DVD:</u> There will be a videographer on the Monday night taking a video of both performances. For privacy reasons and copyright issues we ask that you do not take photos or record any of the performances. This DVD is available for purchase.

<u>Pick Up</u>: Pick up from the same area that you dropped off your child. Children need to be marked off a grade list and handed over to you. If a child is being picked up by any other adult (grandparent, relative or friend) please fill out the slip below and return to school as soon as possible.

If there are any last minute changes to these pick arrangements please contact your child's teacher as soon as you can. The <u>approximate</u> pick up times are - first performance 7:15pm second performance 9:15pm.

PREPARE FOR 2020 PAYING BY INSTALMENTS THROUGH CENTREPAY

Families who receive Centrelink benefits can start paying their 2020 Book Pack, Essential and Optional Items by instalment through Centrepay.

What is Centrepay?

Centrepay is a voluntary bill-paying service that is free for Centrelink customers. Through Centrepay, a Customer can authorise Centrelink to deduct regular amounts from their Centrelink payments to pay their bills and expenses to a School or Business.

Centrepay deductions can be used to pay for:

Fees and charges for Book packs and Essential Items and any related educational expenses including equipment, incursions and excursions, camps and swimming.

Benefit to parents:

The money is debited from their Centrelink payments and sent to the school *before* being deposited into their bank—account. The school receipts and allocates to outstanding charges in consultation with the parent. This eliminates the need for parents to 'put money aside' or use a credit card and there is no requirement for them to come to the school to pay their account.

\$20 per fortnight <u>per child</u> in **years P-2** and \$30 per fortnight <u>per child</u> in **years 3-6** for a full year may cover Essential Items and together with the Government's Camps, Sport & Excursion Funding (CSEF) should also cover the cost of camps/excursions/incursions. Parents can include an end date, a target amount or keep it open-ended. The deduction can be amended or cancelled at any time by contacting the school and completing a new form.

What next?:

Please contact the school office (phone or email tyabb.ps@edumail.vic.gov.au) for a form to be sent home or to answer any questions you may have. Please return the completed form to the office and your application will be processed through Centrepay. Your deductions can start immediately or a date of your choosing.

Please don't send your application directly to Centrelink as your **unique account number** is required for identification when the school receives the fortnightly reports from Centrepay.



Curriculum Corner



At Tyabb Primary School our aim is to provide every student with the best learning opportunities. To this end, we provide a well planned curriculum with a strong focus on developing the whole child. Our curriculum is based on the Victorian Curriculum, incorporating Literacy, Numeracy and Inquiry Learning.

Teachers are provided planning time together. During planning time teachers use student data, curriculum documents and appropriate resources to plan for the learning needs of all our students. It ensures consistency and excellence in teaching and learning across the school, while catering for different learning styles and supporting students in making links in their learning and to the world in which they live.

Teachers undertake planned and meaningful assessment by using a variety of assessment tools to assist them in planning for and providing students with the highest quality learning opportunities. With our school review coming up in October we have been auditing our curriculum and how we deliver this to our students to provide the best learning opportunities and outcomes possible.

An integral component of our planning across all areas of the school involves the following critical questions:

FOUR CRITICAL QUESTIONS

What do want students to learn? How do we know they have learned it? What do we do if they don't learn it? What do we do if they already know it?

We use these questions to help us plan, teach, review and assess student learning. These questions are integral to the way we work and are a strong focus in all areas of the curriculum.

This week I have been lucky enough to view some excellent prep writing. It is amazing the amount of learning that takes place in prep in just 12 months. Already, 9 months in, our preps are beginning to be fantastic little writers. These two little authors came down to show me some writing they had been doing about the picture story book Mr. B read them in class. It was lovely to have them read their writing to me and then we had a big discussion about the book.

This week, we have been learning how to read maps and identify the different positions of key features.




We have enjoyed describing the different positions of our classmates in our warm up games and interpreting key features on a range of different maps.

'Wear it Wild'

Fundraising day for Asian Elephants

Thank you to all our Tyabb Primary School families for supporting our 'Wear it Wild' by wearing wild animal print clothing and/or donating a gold coin for our fundraising to help save Asian elephants from extintion. As part of the Studies of Asia elective group, senior students researched these highly intelligent and self aware beings. One part of this research project was for students to think of ideas which Tyabb Primary School could do to make a difference. These students organised a fundraising event to raise money in hope of adopting Asian elephants from Indonesia. We are very proud to annouce that we raised \$313.05 which will allow us to adopt and support four Asian elephants from the International Elephant Project which is founded by an Australian zoologist called Leif Cocks.







By adopting four female elephants we will be helping with habitat protections, anti- poaching patrols, elephant monitoring, human elephant conflict mitigation and ranger training for an entire herd as females elephants live in family groups. We would like you to meet our elephants which Tyabb P.S have adopted.



Anna is a female elephant living in a herd of about 30 elephants. Her herd lives in a challenging area and they need our protection. Their area provides excellent feeding grounds but does not include large connected natural forests. As a consequence of the fragmented habitat, Anna and her herd frequently come into conflicts with people, especially with farmer's planting palm oil crops which are attractive to elephants.



Freda also lives within a herd of around 30 elephants but has struggled with large scale clear cutting and widespread forest fires which have destroyed most of Freda's original habitat. Her herd has been relocated now.



Cinta, meaning 'love' in Bahasa Indonesia. She is a beautiful adult female Sumatran elephant, living in the Bukit Tigapuluh ecosystem.



Ginting is a beautiful Sumatran elephant living in a herd of over 20 elephants in the Bukit Tigapuluh ecosystem. At over 30 years of age, she had her male calf Chrisna with her when she was first collared. Chrisna was only a few weeks old at the time but the baby bull has developed into a buffalo sized healthy youngster, always up for trouble and play!

Thank you for helping Tyabb P.S keep elephants wild and free!
