2020 PREPARATION



PREPARE FOR 2020 PAYING BY INSTALMENTS THROUGH CENTREPAY

Families who receive Centrelink benefits can start paying their 2020 Book Pack, Essential and Optional Items by instalment through Centrepay.

What is Centrepay?

Centrepay is a voluntary bill-paying service that is free for Centrelink customers. Through Centrepay, a Customer can authorise Centrelink to deduct regular amounts from their Centrelink payments to pay their bills and expenses to a School or Business.

Centrepay deductions can be used to pay for:

Fees and charges for Book packs and Essential Items and any related educational expenses including equipment, incursions and excursions, camps and swimming.

Benefit to parents:

The money is debited from their Centrelink payments and sent to the school *before* being deposited into their bank—account. The school receipts and allocates to outstanding charges in consultation with the parent. This eliminates the need for parents to 'put money aside' or use a credit card and there is no requirement for them to come to the school to pay their account.

\$20 per fortnight <u>per child</u> in **years P-2** and \$30 per fortnight <u>per child</u> in **years 3-6** for a full year may cover Essential Items and together with the Government's Camps, Sport & Excursion Funding (CSEF) should also cover the cost of camps/excursions/incursions. Parents can include an end date, a target amount or keep it open-ended. The deduction can be amended or cancelled at any time by contacting the school and completing a new form.

What next?:

Please contact the school office (phone or email tyabb.ps@edumail.vic.gov.au) for a form to be sent home or to answer any questions you may have. Please return the completed form to the office and your application will be processed through Centrepay. Your deductions can start immediately or a date of your choosing.

Please don't send your application directly to Centrelink as your **unique account number** is required for identification when the school receives the fortnightly reports from Centrepay.

Student Voice and Agency

In education, **student voice** refers to the values, opinions, beliefs, perspectives, and cultural backgrounds of individual **students** and groups of **students** in a school, and to instructional approaches and techniques that are based on **student** choices, interests, passions, and ambitions.

Student agency refers to learning through activities that are meaningful and relevant to learners, driven by their interests, and often self-initiated with appropriate guidance from teachers. To put it simply, **student**

agency gives **students** voice and often, choice, in how they learn.

Student Voice and Agency is a real focus in education. At Tyabb Primary School we always value the input and ideas of our students in their learning and their everyday experiences at school.

As you would know, our sporting houses are:

Benton (represented by the colour white)

Coolart (represented by the colour blue)

Baxter (represented by the colour gold)

Jones (represented by the colour green)

These sport house names have history behind them, having been named for specific reasons.

BENTON

Mrs Harriet Barton was the first sewing mistress at Tyabb PS. Mr Benton helped compose the first letter re the establishment of Tyabb PS.

COOLART

Main road dividing Tyabb from Moorooduc.

BAXTER

Mr Baxter, a local land owner, donated the land for the first Tyabb school. The school opened on 6th July 1891.

JONES

Eva and Mary Jones attended Tyabb PS in 1917. The school now borders Jones Road.

Below is a letter received from a grade 5 student with regards to our sporting house Benton.

Dear Mrs Howden and Ms Grinsted,

It's ridiculous that Benton has to wear white. White doesn't make you feel great, imaging having to wear it at sport events. White isn't even a colour! Every sport event my white top goes from clean to mean. I believe that Benton should change to red immediately.

We think that red wasn't a chosen colour due to the clash with the uniform. Now that we have changed our uniform to navy blue pants there will be no clash!!

We are pretty confident that the students will be fine with this change of colour and are asking parents to also consider this change.

As mentioned by Georgia in her persuasive piece, this would be a slow process over a year so that parents don't have to go out and buy a new top immediately.

If agreed to by our current Benton members, 2020 Prep students will start the move with wearing red to represent Benton. The other students in Benton house can wear white or red for 2020 /2021 and then we will implement the colour red fully.




