#### **END OF TERM ONE!**

What a sad and hastened end to what was an extremely positive start to the year. Who would have thought a couple of weeks ago that we would be experiencing a world health crisis that would result in the holidays being brought forward and the closure of many non-essential services. The feeling is quite surreal, anxiously waiting and preparing for the unknown when everything outside of our windows looks the same. Our anxiety levels have not been helped by the barrage of news reports and conflicting points of view on what we should do to prepare and how this will affect our children's schooling.

We have done our best to keep you up to date and provide support to your children during this challenging time. I thank our amazing teachers for their tireless efforts and huge team commitment to prepare for the unknown while continuing to support our students. This has all been done with a positive attitude and smiles on their faces throughout the day for our wonderful students. We also thank you for your patience, support and kind words of appreciation. It is times like this that can bring out the very best in people and help us to appreciate what is truly important in life.

Please know that our thoughts are with you during this difficult time. Our staff appreciate the challenges that this virus has, and will continue to cause, not only to the possible health of those around us but also to the livelihoods and lifestyles we have become use to. We really wish our students and families all the best over the school holidays and coming weeks. We will continue to be there to support our children in whatever way possible.

### What will happen next term?

We do not know at this stage. Our Prime Minister has announced that he hopes that schools will return next term, though others will conflict with this thinking. The status of this health crisis changes daily so we will not be sure of this until possibly the end of the term holidays. We are unsure, and know as much as you, but will follow whatever instructions we are given by the Education Department.

Our teachers have worked tirelessly over the past couple of weeks to prepare just in case there is a closure and we need to provide online learning. Teachers have prepared work packs to support you in the first couple of weeks of term 2, just in case our school does not return. They have been learning how to provide you with further options for online learning should this continue. This is unprecedented and they have done their best to prepare given the time they have had and the resources available.

We also appreciate that, for many of you, following these learning plans at home could be a challenge. You may not have computers or ipads or enough for all of your children. You may have life challenges and other distractions that make following these work programs difficult or impossible. You may not understand how to support your child with these learning tasks. We will understand that this is challenging but will support you and your children wherever possible.

In the event that we do not return next term or you choose to keep your child / children at home we would like to provide you with the following information:

### **Whole School Communication**

We will keep you updated via <u>flexibuzz</u>. This will be the main method of our whole school communication. If you do not have this App on your phone or computer, please follow the instructions below. It is through this platform that we will keep you updated and confirm when school will return.

We will still provide a brief <u>fortnightly newsletter</u> as we feel it is important to update you on the latest information and provide some positive information like your children's birthdays.



# <u>Communication to parents from class teachers</u> and vice versa in the event of a closure

After the school holidays please email your child's class teacher for any queries in regards to their online learning. Please note that teachers will only respond to these emails during working hours 9 – 4.30 after the school holidays. This email address and communication is for teacher/parent not students.

- You have been provided with your child/children's email addresses through the email sent to you and on the opening letter of your child's work pack.

- We will be checking our school email daily and emails will be forwarded on to the appropriate person.

As you can see, we are trying to keep communication links between school and home in the event that we do not open. This may not occur and it could be business as usual. Please be patient with us and respect the fact that we have our own families, commitments and challenges during this time and may not reply straight away. We will generally read and respond during working hours. We may also prefer to ring you as it is often difficult to explain something in writing and easier to communicate over the phone.

# **Curriculum Corner**



### **HOME READING**

What a terrific start to the year with so many students already reaching 25 nights of home reading or more! We are thrilled to see that so many families are encouraging a love of reading by offering a supportive environment at home where learning is valued.

Every child in the school also has a book to record their reading nights so please ensure that you fill this in and sign it.
When your child



reads, we ask that you sit with them, offering support where required. It is important that your child also shares their knowledge of the book they read.



You can encourage this by asking simple questions such as:

Can you tell me what happened in the story?
What was the problem in the story and how was it solved?

Why did the character ?

How do you think the character was feeling when \_\_\_\_\_?

Does this book remind you of anything?

Asking questions helps readers monitor their comprehension and stay engaged and interested in their reading.

The students at Tyabb Primary School are already engaging in a variety of reading opportunities our



teachers offer daily. The research is conclusive: When teachers and parents work together to support children's reading and academic success, learning outcomes for all children improve. Thank you once again for your ongoing support at home by encouraging and motivating your child to read often.



# Classroom Capers

# Grade 4B

In Term One, we started the year with a great time getting to know each other and setting expectations. As a grade we came up with our motto:

We like to learn and be resilient


Kindness is our thing

### Reading:

In Reading Grade 4B has shown excellent reading stamina during Independent Reading. They are





The students are especially skilled at writing a main event sentence (which they should be doing in their Reading Diaries as well). We have learned various reading strategies such as making connections (to self or to other texts),

using text features (such as glossaries and indexes), searching for and using information and monitoring our reading.

We have learned about syllables in spelling and how that helps us break up unknown words when we are reading tool!







Students enjoy the privilege of choosing a special seat to do their reading.

### Writing:

Our first text type studied was biographies. Through this text type we looked at the punctuation feature of brackets and the grammar feature of connectives. We learnt about the structure of a biography and how to write good quality texts. Using the Seven Steps strategies, we made our biographies more interesting by including a Sizzling Start (make the reader curious) and by using Show, Don't Tell to describe how great our person was/is. We also learned about quotes.




# Classroom Capers



Our first biography was about our teacher. Students enjoyed finding out about the mischief that Ms Woff got up to as a child. They listened to anecdotes from her life and asked questions. The next biography was about a classmate. Students enjoyed

interviewing each other to find out facts which were written in keywords on a plan. Another biography was about a community member who helped which was related to our Civics Inquiry.

Our final biography was about a famous person of our own choice. Students used the internet to research, write keywords and discuss their ideas with friends/family. We completed a Big Write for this particular biography. Grade four students are really enjoying Writing! Especially when we play soft music, dim the light and get out our special

writing tools - candles, writing trays and quills.

Mathematics: This Term, we had a focus on revisiting



times table facts that we had learned last year. We have been looking at patterns, listening to Math Rockx and discussing the two, three, five and ten times tables. Next term, we will start learning the grade four level times tables - 4, 6, 7, 8, 9 and

this will continue to be a focus for our homework. Throughout the Math Workshop Cycle we learned a lot about place value. It was interesting being with different teachers and different students to learn what we needed to, at our point of need.

### **Inquiry:**

Our first Inquiry was into Civics. We learned about people who help in the community, government and law. After gaining some background knowledge students chose an area of



government they wanted to learn more about then imparted this knowledge to a classmate. Finally, they "designed" their own country. Made laws, and consequences, decided on a system of government as well as designing a flag or coat of arms for their country.

### Reminders

Reading Diaries should be filled in every time a student reads. Parents can fill them in any way they would like. However, if a student fills in their reading diary themselves, they must write a main event sentence.



Students should be reading 5 nights per week for 20 minutes or more each time. (Ten minutes is acceptable on a busy evening). By the end of Term One, students should be up to 40 Nights of Reading. If your child is not, please consider reading 7 times per week to catch up on that valuable practice time.

Homework is given out each Friday and is due back the following Wednesday.






