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END OF TERM ONE!

We would like to congratulate our students for a fabulous term 1. After the challenges of last year we have all been extremely grateful to be at school each day and making the most of getting back to some normality. Whilst we have still been unable to hold large school events with parents we have still managed a term full of exciting programs and a few extra curricula activities. We had two camps— grade 4 camp to Phillip Island and grade 6 Camp Woorabinda at Yallourn North. We also had an inter school tennis tournament, district swimming, lightning prem and today we had our end of term Easter bonnet parade. We thank our students, teachers and parents for an extremely positive first term.

EASTER BONNET PARADE

Sincere apologies for not being able to have parents at our Easter Bonnet Parade. As a mum myself, I know how special and important these events are for parents and would never stop or limit access to such events unless we were forced to do so. I also know how special it is to our students to have their parents or grandparents at special events like this. My own children loved having me at special events and assemblies and the smiles on their faces were priceless. We want you to see your child's smiling faces at these events and give parents every opportunity to be a part of their child's schooling.

I know that we have received some criticism for excluding parents and that it seems unfair when tens of thousands of people can go to the footy. But we do not make the rules or set the guidelines. We follow the Department of Education Guidelines as stated below:

"There continues to be no requirement to limit the number or type of visitors to school premises, however the density limit of 1 person per 2 square metres should be applied to any spaces and activities being attended by parent/carers and other visitors. The density limit applies to all persons in the space, including students."

This made having parents in the hall impossible. We were also unable to hold the event outside as we did not have the sound system and technology to support this and every parent would have needed to sign in—also a requirement as anyone on the site for more than 15 minutes must sign in and register their details. Please know that we want parents at these events and truly hope that these restrictions change and that we are able to open up our doors during term 2.

PROCESS / SCHOOL TOURS

At the beginning of next term, we start to open up the school to prospective new parents by inviting them to a school tour. If you know of interested prep parents for 2022 please encourage them to ring the office to book a tour. For parents with siblings starting in 2022 we encourage you to enrol your children early in the term to give us an early indication of our enrolments for the New Year. Enrolment forms will be available in the office at the start of the term.

Curriculum Corner



- Writing at Tyabb Primary School -

Writing is a complex process which is fundamental to constructing and communicating knowledge in all learning areas. Every child can be a successful writer and we make it a priority to teach our students to write imaginative, informative and persuasive texts.

Our writing workshops are designed to offer a simple and predictable learning environment which involves students in the active process of conceiving, planning, composing, editing and publishing a range of texts. Writing involves using appropriate language for particular purposes or occasions, both formal and informal, to express and represent ideas and experiences, and to reflect on these aspects.



Students are offered explicit teaching opportunities where key writing skills are taught using valuable resources including VCOP

and Seven Steps. Our aim is to promote a love of learning in our classrooms and provide students with opportunities to select writing topics that interest and challenge them.



Writer's notebooks are provided as a tool for our students to support their writing and assist them when generating ideas. Children write best about the things that are important to them. It is writing that comes from what they know and what they have experienced. A writer's notebook is a blank book where a writer can engage in the fun, often messy job of being a writer – practising, listing, playing with language, gathering images and ideas.

Students engage in individual writing conferences and are provided with small group practice to ensure all students achieve their writing goals. During this time, students are encouraged to set individual writing goals and reflect on their learning.

At certain points throughout the year, students will complete a 'Cold Write'. Students are given their writing stimulus immediately before writing which allows them to show what they know without external help. It also enables teachers to assess and moderate writing and establish individual writing goals for each student.





Curriculum Corner



How can you support your child's writing at home?

READ, READ, READ!

Regular reading is a stepping stone to better writing and helps kids' strengthen their writing skills. It helps expand children's vocabulary and shows them different ways of using words. This also makes it easier for them to use these words in their own writing.

With younger children, make sure you're reading together every day and encouraging their love of reading as they grow. Start reading early—many children who devour books grow up to become strong writers themselves.

MAKE IT FUN!

Play games and activities that encourage writing. Crossword puzzles and word games are great for everyone. Little ones will especially like the "write the word" game: where they search for items and write down the word when they find each item.

WRITE LETTERS

Today, writing letters is a bit of a lost art. Encourage your child to write letters to friends or family members. Distant family members will especially love receiving handwritten letters and it's a great way to work on improving writing skills for kids.

Pen-pals are also a fun idea, or you can even write letters to each other and leave them around the house to find!

ENCOURAGE JOURNALLING

Keeping a journal is a great way to express thoughts and ideas while also working on improving children's writing skills. Plan an outing to pick a fun journal with your child and encourage them to write in it as much as possible. Make it a part of his or her daily routine.

CREATE A WRITING SPACE

Set aside a little corner in your house that is completely devoted to writing. Having an area dedicated solely to writing will help free your child from distractions so he or she can focus on practicing writing skills.

CONNECT THEIR INTERESTS

Think about your child's favourite book series. Or maybe they're obsessed with dinosaurs. Whatever their interests, connect them to writing. Have your child write a new short story about his or her favourite characters, or let them create a story all about dinosaurs.

USE TECHNOLOGY TO YOUR ADVANTAGE

There's no getting around the fact that technology plays a huge part in our lives. Use it to your advantage by having your child search some wonderful online websites including 'Once Upon a Picture' where they will find various images to inspire creative story writing.
