#### **REPORTS**

I have enjoyed reading many of our student reports over the last couple of weeks to see all of the wonderful achievements our students have made this half year – not only academically but emotionally and socially. It was terrific to read in the student comments how much students enjoy coming to school each day despite the roller coaster between being at school and learning remotely. Reports will be sent home on the last Wednesday of term to give you a picture of where your child sits academically and their future learning goals. Please take the time to celebrate your child's accomplishments focusing on their positive attitude and achievements. There is no doubt that the best outcomes for children happen when teachers and parents work positively together to support children's learning.

In an attempt to provide extra information we have created a new report format, as mentioned in the last newsletter. Key features include:

- Personal comments and progress against our school values which reflect our expectations of behaviour.
- A progression point that shows where your child sits according to the expected standards of the Victorian Curriculum.
- We now have checklists that show your child's achievements against the Victorian Curriculum for the skills/concepts taught that semester.
- A description of the Inquiry Learning Units covered during that semester. These units cover the Science and Humanities requirements of the Victorian Curriculum.
- Specialist progression point against the standards of the Victorian Curriculum and comments.
- Reports will be printed this semester but will be available via the Sentral App in semester 2.

Teachers will be able to answer any questions you may have in relation to your child/children's report at the end of the student led conference first week back.

## STUDENT LED CONFERENCES

**Please note this date in your diaries as students do not attend for the whole day.**

**Week 1 Term 3—Friday 16th July.**

Students will not attend a usual school day on Friday 16th July but will be invited to attend a 20 minute student led conference during that day or after school on Thursday 15th July from 4pm until 7.30pm. Further information regarding this process and our online booking system will be sent home in the next couple of days.

### **What is a student led conference?**

Research tells us that students should be actively involved in their learning and assume responsibility of the learning process. Student Led Conferences motivate students to be accountable for their learning, encourage reflection and help them evaluate their academic progress.

At Tyabb Primary School we use the Student's Learning Journals to help facilitate and guide the discussion during the conference. These Learning Journals will display results and work samples that will demonstrate your child's achievements and growth in a particular skill or subject and provide your child with the opportunity to discuss their learning journey with you. The conference places the child at the centre of the process and allows the student to develop ownership over their learning.

### **Before the conference:**

- ◆ Read your child's school report and discuss it with them
- ◆ Celebrate their achievements from throughout the first semester.

### **On the day:**

- ◆ Plan on spending 20 minutes in your child's classroom.
- ◆ The first 10 minutes will be led by your child.
- ◆ The second 10 minutes will be for any questions about your child's report, their progress and future learning goals.
- ◆ Be prepared to talk with your child about his/her strengths and areas for growth.
- ◆ Understand that this is a time for your child to take the lead and demonstrate their learning.

### **During the conference:**

- ◆ Please be supportive of the work and the results that your child has achieved.
- ◆ Use language that your child understands.
- ◆ Enjoy the discussions with your child and their teacher.
- ◆ Please give positive feedback to your child.
- ◆ Use sentence starters such as "I like how you..." or "What did you learn from?" to stimulate discussion.
- ◆ Please celebrate your child's learning journey together.

### **After the conference:**

- ◆ Talk with your child about the conference and their learning goals.
- ◆ Remember to regularly check in with your child regarding progress toward his/her learning goals.
- ◆ Remember the student led conference is a great opportunity to celebrate learning.

Last Friday Meg Huther started her maternity leave as she waits to have her first child. We wish Meg and her partner Chris all the best for this next chapter in their lives.






# Classroom Capers

### We LOVE reading...



### We are Authors...



We are learning how to work together to solve problems like Mathematicians.




We explored the relationship between Addition and Subtraction. We had so much fun making Fact Family Houses!




We made posters to show a variety of Addition Strategies we can use when solving problems.




