With the hope that children return to school on Friday 3rd September, Jantina Forecast our PFA president, has been busy organising gifts for our annual Father's Day stall. Unfortunately we are unsure whether children will return on that date and have had to work out a Plan A and Plan B to give our children an opportunity to purchase a small surprise gift.

PLAN A

If all children return to school on Friday 3rd September we will run our Father's Day Stall as we have done in previous years and give a time for each grade/child to visit the stall and buy a \$5 gift. Welfare



No playgrounds at the moment doesn't mean no fun! Our back yards and nature reserves are still available for us to use in our exercise timeframe and 5km radius (fingers crossed you are able to access an area within 5km from your home).

Here are some suggestions to help you survive the remainder of the lockdown with your children:



Collect garden snails. Draw a start and finish line. Have a snail race. Remember to wash your hands when you've held a snail.



Make, decorate and fly a kite.



Locate busy ants on a sunny day. What are they doing? Where are they going? How do they communicate? Sprinkle bread crumbs.

Observe what happens.



Scatter some flower seeds in the soil (pop a packet in your supermarket trolley) to attract pollinators into your garden.



Place a piece of thick cardboard in your garden with a rock or brick on top. Leave for a week. Lift and check who has 'moved in'.



Go on a bug hunt.

Use water and a paintbrush on the pavement to paint the insects you find. Research how to construct a backyard bug hotel to house insects



Welfare



Find a dish for water, some rocks to sun on, bark and leaves to attract insects and native grasses to make a "lizard lounge" in your garden ready for Spring.



Go for a walk in the bush or a local nature reserve. Locate a new native animal in the wild.

Give it a name.



Play floating and sinking games with the natural objects you collect on walks, such as seed pods, rocks, feathers and leaves. Which ones float? Which ones sink?



Photograph / record special sights and sounds you notice / hear in nature on your walks around the block. Repeat in a week. What is the same? What is different? There are so many seasonal changes happening at the moment!



Paint or draw a picture of your favourite sighting in nature. Oil pastels on coloured paper or chalk on pavement looks great (might be an outline of your shadow). Chalk will work really well too.



Join a local online library. Read a book together, to learn more about your local flora and fauna.



Lie back on a picnic rug and look up at the clouds. How many special shapes can you find in the clouds? A dog, dinosaur, a duck or maybe a dragon?



Write a cheerful note to lonely neighbours and pop it into their letterbox with a hand picked posy. Ride your bikes and scooters on a 'delivery mission'.

Curriculum Corner



IN THE SCIENCE LAB.

Our grade 3 students started the term being involved in multiple STEM challenges. STEM being an acronym for activities that include Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths concepts. Working cooperatively with a partner, using only 10 sheets of newspaper and 1 metre of tape, they were encouraged to design a table that was 15cm high, had to have at east 2 legs and could support the weight of a heavy book. Then, after discussions and investigations around strength and stability, the students had to build their table in a given time frame. During testings throughout the process, many discovered that they needed to go back to the drawing board and re evaluate what they had designed— all part of the learning of the Scientific Process!!























Preps have been learning about what science is. It is the study of everything around us- the oceans, the forests, space and everything in them. We also learnt about our 5 senses and how they help scientists discover and invent things. Grades 1 and 2 discovered some different properties of matter and learnt to distinguish between solids, liquids and gases.



Canteen News

New Canteen Ordering System

Our school canteen is very excited to announce that we will be moving to online ordering starting with canteen lunch next week. This means that you can register today and put your order in!

It is as simple as downloading the Sentral App on your mobile phone and then completing the following steps:

Open Sentral App.

Click on the Link button on the Sentral home screen.

Click on Canteen link. This will take you to QuickCliQ.

Sign up and complete registration form.

Receive a link via email to ACTIVATE your account before logging in.

ADD STUDENT. Add your child's details, select their school and save to your account.

ADD CREDIT to your online wallet before ordering or pay as you go using credit or debit card.

Select MEAL ORDER and you're good to go.

Orders can be placed up to 28 days in advance, however weekly lunch specials will be available to order from Wednesday afternoon for the following week. You will view these on QuickcliQ through the Sentral App.

Please note that this online ordering system is only for LUNCH orders and Tuck Shop will operate as normal accepting cash over the counter at lunch time.

Things you need to know:

Cut off time for online ordering is 9.15am Tuesday.

If you need to cancel the order this must be done prior to 9.15am on the Wednesday to receive a full refund (minus booking fee).

To top up your QuickCliQ Wallet you have 3 options-

Direct Debit- 50c transaction fee. ** This is the most cost effective option**

(e.g. If you put \$50 into your Quickcliq wallet at the start of Term you will only pay this 50c transaction fee once until you need to top up again.)

Credit Card- The surcharge is 1.5%

PayPal- The surcharge is 3.8%

When placing an order there is a small 21c fee per order per student.

Families will no longer need to provide a lunch order bag. If you have recently purchased canteen bags from the school please contact the school office to arrange a credit on your school account upon return of bags. Bags must be unused.

***Please note that it takes 2-3 business days for direct deposit money to appear in your QuickCliq wallet. Credit card

payments can be used until the funds appear in your account***

If you need any assistance with QuickCliQ their support team are available Monday to Friday, 7.30am to 4pm on 1300 11 66 37.

Families will have until the end of Term 3 to transition over to the new online system.

With that said, our Online Store is still operational during lockdown, so we're happy to announce that we're offering free shipping via Australia Post on all orders over \$100. The shipping fee will be waived automatically once the cart exceeds \$100.

Please note that we will endeavour to ship out orders as soon as possible during this time, however please keep in mind we're currently working at reduced capacity due to restrictions in Metro Melbourne.

We hope this makes our uniforms more accessible to your School community during this time.
