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#### **COVID UPDATE**

## HANDS OFF





The value of *RESPECT* is a major focus throughout the 2022 school year for all students and staff at Tyabb Primary School.

Respect includes: being kind and caring, accepting and including others, actively listening, using good manners, following staff instructions, caring for property / the environment and much, much more.

Our 2021 Attitudes To School Survey results were very positive, but one area that our staff want to work on is the fact that 19% of our students mentioned that they had been hit, kicked or punched at school. As a staff we want this percentage to drop dramatically, hence the use of "Hands Off".

During the last fortnight, students were informed that we will be focusing strongly on positive behaviour decisions in the playground and following up with those children who make the wrong choice.

Our students have reacted positively to this and to date, there have been a small number of time outs given to those students who have made negative choices and used physical actions inappropriately.

If your child is involved in an incident that is not following the "Hands Off" request, you will receive a letter with an attached time out form to sign.

At the same time, students who are making the positive decisions are receiving praise and house points for their good choices.

I encourage all parents to discuss the importance of making good choices in the playground, especially when there are times that they may be provoked. Your support with this would be very much appreciated so that we can continue to work and learn together at a really wonderful school.


## **SPELLING at Tyabb PS 2022**

Welcome to our Spelling program at Tyabb Primary School for 2022. This year across our school we are implementing a comprehensive spelling and word study program. This program has nine areas of learning in spelling and has a sequenced and developmental structure that allows teachers to ensure that each part of spelling is a focus for student learning and achievement.

WHAT DO STUDENTS NEED TO THE NINE AREAS OF LEARNING. 1. Early Literacy Concepts 2. Phonological Awareness Letter Knowledge 4. Letter Sound Relationships 5. Spelling Patterns 6. High Frequency Words 7. Word Meaning/ Vocabulary 8. Word Structure 9. Word-Solving Actions

#### TAKE HOME SPELLING LISTS

You will be aware that spelling is now part of our at home learning on a daily basis. Students have been given an Oxford Spelling Words folder that has a word list in it each week that has focus words that are specifically targeted to each individual student.



Teachers have ensured that the spelling focus skills that are taught throughout the week are included along with high frequency words that students need to learn. Please take time to revise your child's spelling list words each night as part of the home reading time. 10 to 15 minutes is all that is required to revise and practise these words. You can complete the 'Look, Cover, Write, Check' task and if you feel like you have time, add some quick oral spelling games to ensure retention of the spelling words.

Each week students will be tested on their spelling words and assessment checklists are updated to make sure that students can gauge their achievements. It is a great incentive to move through the Oxford Word Lists and help students write and spell this high frequency words in their writing during literacy times.



We would like to say a huge thank you to the students, parents and families who have already embraced our weekly spelling lists and spent time revising these at home as part of their daily reading program! Teachers are already seeing lots of fabulous results and progress with these words. Well done Tyabb! Your spelling is BUZZING!






