COVID UPDATE


Thank you to our parents for their continued support with testing their children and informing us if their child is positive. This information is used to notify other parents in a class or year level and encourage them to monitor for symptoms and keep students home if positive. This helps us to minimise the spread across the school. In the last couple of days we have had an increase in cases across the school. Multiple cases emphasise the need to continue to maintain covid safety measures:

- Staying home if unwell
- Monitoring for symptoms
- Regular RAT testing
- Regular hand hygiene
- Face masks for staff and year 3-6
- Ventilation through open windows, doors and air purifiers

Thank you for your continued support. We hope that our students and family members who have tested positive are recovering well .






World Maths Day 2022






Classroom Capers

The Writing Process




