PARENT OPINION SURVEY COMING SOON

WE WANT OUR PARENTS/CAREGIVERS/ GUARDIANS TO TELL US WHAT THEY THINK!

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents/caregivers/guardians think of our school. The Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training that is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of families' perceptions of school climate, student behavior, and student engagement. We encourage all families to participate in this survey. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

While previously a random sample of approximately 30 per cent of parents/caregivers/guardians have been selected to participate, this year, all families are invited to participate in the survey. The Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Opinion Survey will be conducted from **Monday 15th August to Friday 16th September.**

The survey will be conducted **online**, only takes **20 minutes** to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the fieldwork period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones.

SAFETY CONCERNS / TRAFFIC ISSUES



As mentioned in a recent Sentral post, we have recently seen an increase in the number of parents parking illegally in NO STOPPING ZONES or Disabled Parking Spots.

We appreciate that there will always be traffic and parking issues at 3.30pm due to the high volume of students leaving both Tyabb PS and Flinders College. With patience the traffic is always clear by 3.50pm. We urge you to consider your children's safety and the safety of others when you are dropping off and picking up from the school by considering the following:



- Please obey all parking restrictions and signage including NO STOPPING zones. Parents are not permitted to park opposite the school and crossing this road is extremely dangerous for both you and your child. NO STOPPING zones are there to keep people safe and are fully enforced with fines given when breached.
- Obey the 5 minute parking rule at the front of our school between 3.30 – 4.00pm. Stress to your child to 'watch and wait' so you do not need to get out of the car to look for your child. A speedy changeover of cars improves the flow of traffic.
- Please do not stop and wait in the middle of Jones Road for a spot. This blocks the flow of traffic. If there is not a parking spot please keep moving along to see if there are spots further on. Parents often stop when there are spots further on. If there is not a spot continue along Jones Road, turn around and come back for another attempt. To turn around you must drive around McLaurin Drive and turn back on to Jones Road or continue to the Bungower roundabout.

DISABLED PARKING – IT IS ILLEGAL TO STOP OR PARK IN A DISABLED PARKING SPOT WITHOUT A PERMIT



We currently have two parking spots at the front of our school designated for disabled parking. These are clearly marked with both a painted symbol and sign. A disabled parking space can only be used by someone who has been issued with a blue / white disabled parking permit displayed prominently in the vehicle. **Parking in these spaces without a permit is illegal and can lead to a significant on the spot fine.** We appreciate that parking spots are limited at our school but need to ask that you be considerate of our parents and visitors with disabilities that limit their access in to our school.





Inquiry Learning

The Process of Inquiry

When teachers assist students at Tyabb Primary School to use the Inquiry Approach, they use a series of steps to help students get the most out of their investigations.

Tuning In
Finding Out
Sorting Out
Going Further
Drawing Conclusions
Reflecting

What happens during tuning in?

Engagement and gathering prior knowledge, pre-assessment, questions for inquiry, goal setting. Sometimes, students will require some early immersion or 'frontloading' in the topic if little is known/experienced. Some questions may emerge from students at this stage. What theories do we have? What do we already understand about this topic?

What happens during the finding out stage?

Experiences such as excursions are presented to students. Information and texts that add to knowledge are used so students can gather data first hand and in a range of ways. Knowledge and experiences are shared with the group. Data gathering through engaging with experts, surveys, interviews, film, experiments, observations or field work can also add to the finding out stage.

What is sorting out? Organising, analysing and communicating the information gathered using a range of tools. This can be done through various learning areas too eg: through maths, arts, English, drama, music, technology. Reflective thinking occurs - revising original theories. Reviewing the big question. What meaning can we make of this data? What are we learning?



Then What?

Students may go back to the start of the process. They may investigate more questions or they may present their ideas to a wider audience.

What's Reflecting?

Taking action.
Reflecting on the unit. How and why did I learn? What did I learn about this topic? What did I learn about myself? What should I do now?

What happens when drawing conclusions?

Stating understandings – what do we think and know now? How do we feel? High level thinking about the topic. Identifying avenues for action and application. Generalising

What happens with going further?

Raising or revisiting questions. Opportunities for students to pursue questions or issues/interests of their own or in small groups. These questions may be picked up from earlier in the inquiry or have emerged from the shared inquiry.




We got excited when the bus stopped. We hopped off. We were so excited to be there and couldn't wait to see all the animals. We were the first group to go on the wallaby walk. We had to walk through with hushed voices so that we didn't upset or scare them. We were so excited to feed the wallabies. They were so cute and gentle.

Next, we saw TimTam the Tasmanian Devil. She was so cute too and her partner Ronald. The keeper fed her raw chicken and told us that Tasmanian Devils are scavengers. They eat fur and bones from all the dead animals lying around. After seeing Tim Tam, we went over to the dingos and learnt that the girl dingo is always the boss. They also have thin bodies and wider heads so that they can fit through narrow spaces. Next, we saw a Cockatoo that could talk. There were lots of other birds there such as kookaburras, bower birds, owls and parrots. One of the parrots was an Orange-Bellied Parrot which are endangered. There are only 70 of them left. When we went to the reptile enclosure, we got to hold a carpet python. We also met a Bearded Dragon and a Shingleback lizard. They were so cool. The bearded dragon looks as though its spikes are sharp but they are actually very soft. We learnt that reptiles are ectothermic, which means that their body temperature varies with the temperature of its surroundings.

After lunch, we walked around the rest of the park and then got back on the bus to go back to school. Our favourite part was when we got to feed the wallabies and hold the carpet python.






Classroom Capers


