

During this year it has been noted by many of our teachers that a number of our students are really struggling with their resilience skills. This is not unusual in children at times, but since our last two years of uncertainty it is becoming an area of concern. If you are concerned about your child's resilience level please read tips below and touch base with your child's teacher or Kris Grinsted at the school.

## 10 Tips for building resilience in children

We all can develop resilience, and we can help our children develop it as well. It involves behaviours, thoughts and actions that can be learned over time. Following are tips to building resilience:

### **Make connections**

Teach your child how to make friends, including the skill of empathy, or feeling another's pain. Encourage your child to be a friend. Build a strong family network to support your child through his or her inevitable disappointments and hurts.

### **Help your child by having him or her help others**

Children who may feel helpless can be empowered by helping others. Together with your child brainstorm ways they can help others.

### **Maintain a daily routine**

Sticking to a routine can be comforting to children, especially younger children who crave structure in their lives. Encourage your child to develop his or her own routines.

### **Take a break**

While it is important to stick to routines, endlessly worrying can be counter-productive. Teach your child how to focus on something besides what's worrying him.

### **Teach your child self-care**

Make yourself a good example, and teach your child the importance of making time to eat properly, exercise and rest. Make sure your child has time to have fun, and make sure that your child hasn't scheduled every moment of his or her life with no "down time" to relax. Caring for oneself and even having fun will help your child stay balanced and better deal with stressful times.

### **Move toward your goals**

Teach your child to set reasonable goals and then to move toward them one step at a time. Moving toward that goal — even if it's a tiny step — and receiving praise for doing so will focus your child on what he or she has accomplished rather than on what hasn't been accomplished, and can help build the resilience to move forward in the face of challenges.

## Nurture a positive self-view

Help your child remember ways that he or she has successfully handled hardships in the past and then help him understand that these past challenges help them build the strength to handle future challenges. Help your child learn to trust himself to solve problems and make appropriate decisions. Teach your child to see the humor in life, and the ability to laugh at one's self.

## Keep things in perspective and maintain a hopeful outlook

Even when your child is facing very painful events, help them look at the situation in a broader context and keep a long-term perspective. Although your child may be too young to consider a long-term look on his own, help him or her see that there is a future beyond the current situation and that the future can be good. An optimistic and positive outlook enables your child to see the good things in life and keep going even in the hardest times.

## Look for opportunities for self-discovery

Tough times are often the times when children learn the most about themselves. Help your child take a look at how whatever he/she is facing can teach him/her "what he/she is made of."

## Accept that change is part of living

Change often can be scary for children. Help your child see that change is part of life and new goals can replace goals that have become unattainable.

# Curriculum Corner



Maths is always fun at Tyabb! Come and NumeraSEE what we're doing!

## GRADE PREP

Prep students have been working really hard learning all about addition. They have played some great games like 'Get out of my house!' and have practised strategies like 'counting on' and 'doubling'.

## GRADE 1

The Grade 1's have been learning all about division these past two weeks. They have been playing lots of different games and using lots of different objects to learn how to share equally and identify if there is a remainder.



## GRADE 2

Do you have a problem that needs to be solved? Our grade two students have been using division to solve real life problems. They have been grouping equals sets and linking division to fractions. Our grade twos can partition objects to show halves, quarters and eighths.

## GRADE 3

Students in Grade 3 are working to learn times tables facts to help us prepare for solving division equations. Quick recall of multiplication facts has been practised daily in games, such as 'Get out of my house 3.0', where partners challenge each other to complete three number sentences in each turn to find the product. Soon we will be playing the game in reverse to explore finding the quotient.




## GRADE 4

Alongside their work on division, our grade 4 mathematicians have been learning about 3D shapes and the nets we can use to make them. They have made posters and found symmetry in shapes. They have also been working hard on probability while learning chance vocabulary and ordering the likelihood of occurring events.

## GRADE 5

Grade 5s have been exploring their understanding of time, connecting am and pm notation to 24 hour time as well as calculating elapsed time and reading timetables. They have also focused on division, using the 'apple tree problem' to write and solve division problems with remainders.



## GRADE 6

The school leaders have been taking Maths to a whole new level by working on divisibility tests. They have learned many handy strategies for finding if a number can be divided by another number. Our grade 6 students have practised multiplying and dividing decimal numbers by powers of 10. They have recently learned a variety of multiplication strategies including the box method, lattice method and long multiplication.

## MATHLETICS COMPETITION

For Term 3, all students have been challenged to see how many Mathletics points they can earn in a 2-week period. Awards have been up for grabs at assembly and we have seen some amazing numbers! Here are our winners from the last two assemblies.
