

In 2B we loved celebrating Book Week and coming as our favourite book characters. We had some awesome costumes which we enjoyed showing off on stage at our Book Week Paradel







### **Curriculum Corner**




<u>Art</u> for term three has focussed on art in relation to literature, more specifically the titles in this year's


The Theme for this year's Book Week was "dreaming with eyes open". It meant looking at the world and


