Tyabb Primary School is one of 6000 schools across Australia who are registered with the Day for Daniel foundation. This foundation commenced in 2008 after the disappearance of Daniel Morcombe in Queensland. 

# SPELLING

# Why is spelling so important?

Spelling, the art of correctly assembling words from their letters, is one of the essential components of successful writing. Being confident at spelling leads to confidence in all aspects of literacy. The ability to recognise the links between word of the same origin and understanding word relationships has been proven to aid comprehension skills.

Research has found that spelling, reading, writing and comprehension skills are all closely linked. A research study found that spelling instruction improves reading ability, as it builds a learner's knowledge of the alphabetic system as it is used in reading.

Teaching young spellers the strategies, rules and concepts to grow their spelling and vocabulary knowledge benefits them in all aspects of their learning, as well as in their everyday life.

Learners who feel confident with letters and word patterns are able to read and comprehend more complex texts. They also have the necessary language tools to better convey their own ideas through both written and verbal communication.

The relationship between written words and sounds can seem difficult for many learners. But building a strong foundational knowledge of the links between forms, letters, sounds and meaning is essential for students to become confident

## How can I help my child with spelling?

Learning to spell correctly is a crucial skill for life. Children begin to learn the basics of the language as soon as they start school, and their skills and knowledge build as they progress. However, the English language is one of the most difficult languages in the world to learn to spell, as there are so many different ways of spelling the same sounds, and different sounds represented by the same letter patterns! Many words in the English language follow specific rules, and children will be taught these rules at school. However, some words just have to be learnt, and the weekly spelling list can often be greeted with dread by parents!

If you and your child are looking for some new and fun ways to get the spellings of words learnt, try these:

- Use each word in a silly sentence. The sillier the sentence, the more memorable. Underline the spelling word in each sentence.
- Play hangman with a partner, using your words.
- Paint your words onto paper, write them in water with a big brush onto the outside wall of the house, or write them on the ground with coloured chalks
- Make a word search with your words and list them underneath.
- Write out the letters in the words with different coloured felt-tips or pencil crayons.
- Type out the words on the computer.
   Use different fonts and different colours for the different letters.
