## Grade 4B

### Mathematics

Grade 4B have been working steadily on their Mathematics especially focusing on Number. In Term One, they have covered place value, addition and multiplication. We have been looking at time too. Throughout the term, students have enjoyed a variety of activities including hands on tasks, open ended tasks with many possibilities, games, lots of practice and online tasks. One of the favourite tasks was learning about time by playing "What's The Time Mr Wolf?" and drawing clocks with chalk.













## English

So far, Grade 4B have been focusing mainly on biography and narrative writing. We have looked into different ways to improve our writing such as Sizzling Starts, Exciting Endings and Show/Don't Tell. We have investigated the structure of these types of writing as well as learning about special punctuation such as brackets and special types of words/language such as connectives. A popular task is writing and designing in their Writer's Notebooks. Students really liked designing a car and entering the Dream Car Competition.

In Reading, we have also read narratives and biographies. We have learned many strategies including identifying the main idea, making connections, identifying 'good fit' books and solving words. Students enjoy reading with a friend.

# Art room

This term has seen a strong focus on colour, especially for the junior grades. The children have learnt about cool and warm colours, primary and secondary colours, colour mixing and lots of messy fun on the way. From jelly fish, to lions, rainbow umbrellas and lots of other things, the children have learnt to identify colours, create some amazing art work and had loads of fun on the way.



The preps began with self portraits, family drawings and then moved into a bit more messy work creating printed caterpillars, symmetrical butterflies and many more other art tasks.

Grades 1-6 worked on a collaborative art piece for their class that focussed on their hopes and dreams for the future and encouraged them to "reach for the stars."

Grades 3– 6 have explored printing, drawing, design, painting and collage using water colours and paint.

Emphasis was given to final presentations of their work.


