Attitude to School Survey—2023

Each year students in Years 4—6 complete the Attitudes to School Survey. This survey allows the students to have a voice in how they are feeling about their learning and their current school journey. The results from this survey are valuable for the school as it informs us on how all of our students are feeling. It is an anonymous survey, completed online.

Parents of students in years 4—6 will have received a letter outlining this survey.

About the survey

We value student voice as a means to improving student engagement, wellbeing and quality instruction and are conducting a survey to find out what your child thinks of their school.

The AtoSS is an annual student survey offered by the Department of Education to assist schools to gain an understanding of students' perceptions and experience of school. Students will be asked about their thoughts and feelings in relation to their school, their learning, peer relationships, resilience, bullying, health and wellbeing, physical activity, and life in general.

This year, the AtoSS will be conducted at your school from Monday 22nd May to Friday 9th June.

What are the benefits?

Young people enjoy having a say! This survey has been running for nearly 20 years and is invaluable in helping schools understand student views to plan programs and activities to improve your child's schooling experience. The survey responses also help the Department of Education understand how student's learning experiences can be improved.

What are the risks?

While we do not anticipate many risks of participation, some students may find some of the survey questions personal and sensitive in nature. Should you agree for your child to participate, they are still free to skip questions or to withdraw at any stage if the survey makes them upset or uncomfortable. A teacher will be present during the survey to support students.

The questions are selected from validated survey instruments used in Australia and around the world, are strength-based, and tailored for each year level group.

What will my child be asked to do?

Your child will be invited to complete the survey **online during class time** using a purpose built secure online survey tool. It is important to note that we are not in any way "testing" your child. Please note:

Student participation in the survey is voluntary and students may withdraw at any time.

The survey will take around 20-45 minutes to complete.

Attitude to School Survey—2023

How is my child's confidentiality protected?

Your child will be provided with a unique login to complete the survey from their teacher. The student login is an assigned identifier that may be used to link data for statistical and research purposes only. Personally identifiable data will not be recorded in the survey response file to ensure the confidentiality of your child's responses is protected at all times.

How will results be reported?

The survey results will be reported back to the school in aggregate form throughout the survey period. All survey data that is made available in reports are for groups of students only so that no individual student can be identified. Data suppression rules are used for schools with low student numbers per year level.

Your school may share the results of the survey with parents, in documents such as the School Annual Report.

Options for participation

Participation in this survey is **voluntary**. If you **do not** wish for your child to do the survey, please opt out via email to your school: kristine.grinsted@education.vic.gov.au. Please do so before **Monday 22**nd **May 2023**, stating that you wish to opt out of your child's participation, along with their name and year level.

If your school does not receive a Refusal of Consent email from yourself before the survey commencement date mentioned within this letter, it means that you give your consent for your child to participate in the 2023

A copy of the survey that we are asking your child to complete is available from your child's school. Please contact the administration office if you would like to see the survey before making your decision about whether you would like your child to participate.

Classroom Capers

Grade 46

READING

4C have been reading up a storm at school and at home. We already have 6 students who have hit 100 nights of reading!!

This week we have been learning about how authors use extra detail in their writing by using adverbs and adverbial phrases.



MATHS

We have been playing many different games to develop our knowledge of factors and multiples. We have even been learning how to divide with trading and remainders!

WRITING

We love writing in grade 4. Many students have been using amazing writing techniques to write both scary stories and to describe settings. We have used our senses to describe our characters and the settings they are in.

INQUIRY

We are learning about the 3 levels of government and the way that different countries have different laws. In groups we made our own countries and created flags, laws and government styles for them.





Curriculum Corner







At Tyabb Primary School we use the Oxford high frequency words as part of our spelling program. Your child should bring some high frequency words home to learn to spell as part of their home reading/homework program.

Research tells us that the number of words that students know is a predictor of their academic success and opportunities for enhanced life outcomes beyond school (Alderman & Green, 2011; Beck, McKeown & Kucan, 2013), as their literacy skills are implicitly or explicitly judged by those who read what they have written (Hashemi & Ghalkhani, 2016).


Of particular importance is students' effortless knowledge about how to spell high frequency words. As pointed out by Harris, Graham, Aitken, Barkel, Houston & Ray (2017, p. 263), "...it is important that students learn to correctly and automatically spell most words they are likely to use frequently when writing". Inherent and automatic knowledge of high frequency words supports students to become more independent so that they can focus their attention on dealing with low frequency spelling words. This secure knowledge promotes development of their self-efficacy and self-esteem and frees up space to expand students' vocabularies.

Although spelling is taught in the classroom there are also some strategies that parents can put in place to support learning at home. Below are some simple activities you can do with your child to help strengthen their spelling:

- Help your child to understand words are made up of syllables and each syllable has a vowel sound. Say a word and ask how many syllables there are. Help your child to spell each syllable at a time.
- Write words in different coloured pens to make a rainbow or in shaving foam, flour or sand over again to help your child remember them.
- Look with your child at the bits in the words which they find difficult use colours to highlight just the tricky bit.
- Look for the prefixes and suffixes in words, e.g. -tion, -ness and learn these chunks. Explore with your child how many words have the same chunks at the beginning or the end of words.
- Use flashcards or play matching games to let your child see the words lots of times the more times they see the word, the better they will be able to read and spell it.
- Use cut out or magnetic letters to build words together, then mix up the letters and rebuild the word together.
- Find smaller words in the bigger word, for example 'there is a hen in when'.
- Go over the rules of spelling together, e.g. a 'q' is always followed by a 'u'. Ask your child's teacher for the rules they teach in class.






