EDUCATION WEEK

Last week was Education Week in Victorian Schools and we celebrated the theme "Active Learners: Move, Make, Motivate' with a particular focus on hands on learning in mathematics.

On Friday/Monday we had our World of Maths incursion. Each grade level visited the hall which was set up with a range of hands on, problem solving activities. NATIONAL RECONCILIATION WEEK 27TH MAY-3RD JUNE

National Reconciliation Week (NRW) is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia.



The theme for National Reconciliation Week 2023, **Be a Voice for Generations**, encourages all Australians to be a voice for reconciliation in tangible ways in our everyday lives – where we live, work and socialise. The theme urges all Australians to use their power, their words and their actions to create a better, more just Australia for all of us.

At its heart, reconciliation is about strengthening relationships between Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and non-Indigenous peoples, for the benefit of all Australians.

What's the significance of 27 May and 3 June?

27th May marks the anniversary of the 1967 referendum when Australians voted to remove clauses in the Australian Constitution that discriminated against Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. 3rd June marks the historic 1992 Mabo decision in which the High Court of Australia recognised native title—the recognition that Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples' rights over their lands did survive British colonisation. The day before National Reconciliation Week, 26th May, is National Sorry Day, which was first held in Sydney in 1998 and is now commemorated nationally to remember and honour the Stolen Generations.

During National Reconciliation Week each of our classes will be learning about the history and cultures of our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. We will share some of the work we have been doing in our following newsletters.







Please note that you will need to register online with your 2023 photo code to gain access to this year's images.


