STUDENT LED CONFERENCES

Please note this date in your diaries as students do not attend for the whole day. Week 1 Term 3—Friday 14th July.

Students will not attend a usual school day on this date but will be invited to attend a 20 minute student led conference during that day or after school on Thursday 13th July from 4pm until 7.40pm. Further information regarding this process and our online booking system via Sentral was sent out last week.

What is a student led conference?

Research tells us that students should be actively involved in their learning and assume responsibility of the learning process. Student Led Conferences motivate students to be accountable for their learning, encourage reflection and help them evaluate their academic progress.

At Tyabb Primary School we use the Student's Learning Journals to help facilitate and guide the discussion during the conference. These Learning Journals will display results and work samples that will demonstrate your child's achievements and growth in a particular skill or subject and provide your child with the opportunity to discuss their learning journey with you. The conference places the child at the centre of the process and allows the student to develop ownership over their learning.

Before the conference:

- Read your child's school report and discuss it with them
- Celebrate their achievements from throughout the first semester.

On the day:

- ◆ Plan on spending 20 minutes in your child's classroom.
- ◆ The first 10 minutes will be led by your child.
- ◆ The second 10 minutes will be for any questions about your child's report, their progress and future learning goals.
- ◆ Be prepared to talk with your child about his/her strengths and areas for growth.

During the conference:


- ◆ Please be supportive of the work and the results that your child has achieved.
- Use language that your child understands.
- ◆ Please give positive feedback to your child.
- ◆ Use sentence starters such as "I like how you..." or "What did you learn from?"

After the conference:

- ◆ Talk with your child about the conference and their learning goals.
- ◆ Remember the student led conference is a great opportunity to celebrate learning and be proud of their achievements.

NAIDOC WEEK

NAIDOC Week (National Aborigines and Islanders Day Observance Committee) occurs annually in July. NAIDOC is celebrated not only in Indigenous communities, but by Australians all over the country and overseas. At Tyabb Primary School we will recognise NAIDOC week in the first week of term 3 and continue to learn about the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

School Building Fund – Tax Deductible Donations

School Council is inviting donations to a Deductible Gift Recipient Fund through the Tyabb Primary School Building Fund.

The Building Fund was approved by the ATO in 2002 to allow <u>Tax Deductible</u> donations be given to the school in accordance with the Department of Education and Training (DET) DGR funds Guidelines, updated January 2018.

During this time donations to the school's Building Fund has raised funds to complete upgrading the music room, library, multi-purpose hall, split systems installed in all BER classrooms, carpeting most of the classrooms and the shelter between the portables.

Our future projects include continuing the carpeting of school classrooms and administration areas, painting, general maintenance of school buildings and new decking between the portables.

Number of the day!








Each week we have a number of the day, this week we looked at the number 12.


