#### 2023 IS OUR YEAR OF REVIEW

As part of the Department of Education's commitment to continuous improvement and providing the best possible education for our students, each Victorian government school undertakes a formal review every four years. Our review will take place in term 4.

In preparation for this we are currently completing a comprehensive self-evaluation which will involve gathering feedback from students, teachers and community members. The focus of this assessment and school reflection is to help identify:

- what is working well
- what needs to continue
- which areas of the school's work may need to be improved or further developed.

An independent reviewer will analyse our school's performance against the goals and targets in our last four year strategic plan. They will reflect on the feedback we receive from the community and support us in setting our new goals for our new four-year school strategic plan.

We are seeking your help and feedback. Some of this feedback will come from formal assessments such as NAPLAN and our staff, student and parent opinion surveys. We will also be sending out a link in the next couple of weeks to all families to complete a short survey monkey. All of this information will help us to make improvements to provide the best possible education for your children.

## STUDENT LED CONFERENCES

Student led conferences start tonight from 4—7.30pm and all day tomorrow. Please note that students do not attend tomorrow Friday 14th July and only attend for their 20 minute conference. This conference is a chance to share your child's achievements and show how proud you are of them. We hope you all enjoy the experience.

At Tyabb Primary School we use the Student's Learning Journals to help facilitate and guide the discussion during the conference. These Learning Journals will display results and work samples that will demonstrate your child's achievements and growth in a particular skill or subject and provide your child with the opportunity to discuss their learning journey with you. The conference places the child at the centre of the process and allows the student to develop ownership over their learning.

## Before the conference:

- Read your child's school report and discuss it with them
- Celebrate their achievements from throughout the first semester.

## On the day:

- Plan on spending 20 minutes in your child's classroom.
- The first 10 minutes will be led by your child.
- The second 10 minutes will be for any questions about your child's report, their progress and future learning goals.
- Be prepared to talk with your child about his/her strengths and areas for growth.

## **During the conference:**


- Please be supportive of the work and the results that your child has achieved.
- Use language that your child understands.
- Please give positive feedback to your child.
- Use sentence starters such as "I like how you..." or "What did you learn from?"

## After the conference:

- Talk with your child about the conference and their learning goals.
- Remember the student led conference is a great opportunity to celebrate learning and be proud of their achievements.



# Prep C put bears in cares







Prep C love doing maths - especially when there are gummy bears involved! This week we have been learning all about ordinal numbers. That means numbers that put things in order - first, second, third, etc. We started off with one of our favourite stories 'The Very Cranky Bear'. Next we drew caves in our maths books and labelled them 1st to 5th. Next comes the yummy part, everyone had to count out 12 gummy bears and put them in the caves. We then practised using the language of ordinal numbers to describe our bears. For example, 'How many bears are in your third cave?' Which cave has the most/least bears?' 'Put all of your red bears in the fifth cave.' Finally, the best part of all - eating our gummy bears - yum!










