#### WE WOULD LOVE YOUR FEEDBACK

As part of the Department of Education's commitment to continuous improvement and providing the best possible education for our students, each Victorian government school undertakes a formal review every four years. Our review will take place in term 4.

In preparation for this we are currently completing a comprehensive self-evaluation which will involve gathering feedback from students, teachers and community members. The focus of this assessment and school reflection is to help identify:

- what is working well
- what needs to continue
- which areas of the school's work may need to be improved or further developed.

An independent reviewer will analyse our school's performance against the goals and targets in our last four year strategic plan. They will reflect on the feedback we receive from the community and support us in setting our new goals for our new four-year school strategic plan.

On Friday 28th July we will celebrate National

Tree Day by encouraging students to wear a splash of green and donate a gold coin to go towards planting in our environment centre. Keep it simple. Students should still wear school uniform but could wear something green eg socks, hair tie, head band, wrist band, green beanie, green scarf. Our students will do activities in their classrooms, walk through Oliver's Creek and our preps will also get to plant 100 trees with the support of their grade 5 buddies. #### MOBILE PHONE REMINDER TO PARENTS AND STUDENTS

It has come to our attention that several students in our upper grades have been taking their mobile phones in to the playground at playtimes and lunchtimes, which is against our school rules and mobile phone policy. Our classroom teachers have been asked to remind the students of our policy and the governments reasons for making this mandatory across all Victorian Government Schools. The following summary comes directly from our policy. You can access a full version of our policy on our school website by clicking on the following link—Mobile Phone Policy

In accordance with the Department's <u>Mobile Phones</u> <u>Policy</u> issued by the Minister for Education, personal mobile phones must not be used at Tyabb Primary School during school hours, including lunchtime and recess, unless an exception has been granted. Where a student has been granted an exception eg for medical reasons, the student must use their mobile phone for the purpose for which the exception was granted, and in a safe, ethical and responsible manner.

#### Secure storage

Mobile phones owned by students at Tyabb Primary School are considered valuable items and are brought to school at the owner's (student's or parent/carer's) risk. Students are encouraged not to bring a mobile phone to school unless there is a compelling reason to do so. Please note that Tyabb Primary School does not have accident insurance for accidental property damage or theft.

#### Where students bring a mobile phone to school:

Once on <u>school grounds</u> students are not permitted to use their phones. This applies to before and after school while in the school grounds. (The use of a mobile phone includes calls, SMS messages, recording audio, photographs or video, listening to music, games and accessing the internet and all other features.) If a child needs to use their mobile phone before or after school while they wait for parents, they must ask permission and be supervised by a teacher.

Mobile phones are to be given to the class teacher on arrival in the morning for safe storage until the end of the day when they will be returned. Mobile phones must be labelled with the student's name or recognisable identification. Tyabb Primary School will provide secure storage. Secure storage is storage that cannot be readily accessed by those without permission to do so. In most cases this will be a lockable cupboard, drawer or classroom safe.

#### Enforcement

Students who use their personal mobile phones inappropriately at Tyabb Primary School may be issued with consequences consistent with our school's existing student engagement polices e.g. Student Wellbeing and Engagement Policy, Welfare and Discipline Policy or Bullying Prevention policies.

If a student uses a mobile phone contrary to this policy, it will be confiscated and held by the Office until a student's parents/carers come to collect the device. Parents will be contacted to inform them of the phone's confiscation.

At Tyabb Primary School inappropriate use of mobile phones is **any use during school hours**, unless an exception has been granted, and particularly use of a mobile phone:

- in any way that disrupts the learning of others,
- to send inappropriate, harassing or threatening messages or phone calls,
- to engage in inappropriate social media use including cyber bullying,
- to capture video or images of people, including students, teachers and members of the school community without their permission,
- to capture video or images in the school toilets, changing rooms, swimming pools and gyms,
- during exams and assessments.

#### Camps, excursions and extracurricular activities

Tyabb Primary School does not permit the use of mobile phones or personal devices on camps, excursions and extracurricular activities unless there are exceptional circumstances such as those listed above and approval by the Principal/Assistant Principal has been granted.


## NATIONAL DAY OF ACTION AGAINST BULLYING FRIDAY 18<sup>™</sup> AUGUST 2023

This theme supports research findings that strong school community connections and social skills are protective factors in the prevention of bullying and help enable positive, help-seeking behaviours in students.

The National Day of Action will serve as an important platform to raise awareness of bullying and its impact on individuals and communities.


#### I'M FUNDRAISING FOR CANCER COUNCIL VICTORIA TO HELP STOP CANCER.

### In Foundation, we are learning to write RECOUNTS and to use CVC words.








