# National Day of Action against Bullying and Violence



The NDA is Australia's key bullying prevention initiative, encouraging whole-school communities to work together to implement evidence-informed positive and proactive solutions to prevent and address bullying. The NDA theme for 2023 was 'growing connections'. This theme supports research findings that strong school community connections and social skills are protective factors in the prevention of bullying.

At Tyabb Primary we promote positive behaviours through the teaching and regular reinforcement of our values and our involvement in the Respectful Relationships Program. On Friday each classroom conducted social skills sessions, bullying prevention activities, stories and conversations about positive behaviours. Classes made a pledge to each other to show respect and a zero tolerance to bullying behaviour. We met on the basketball court in the shape of the words NO BULLYING and made a pledge to show respect for each other and have a united zero tolerance towards bullying.

Fully registered as a psychologist with the Australian Health Practitioner Registration Association (AHPRA) since 2008, Liz has completed a Master's degree in Health Psychology at Monash University, and also a Supervised Practice Plan in Darwin and Melbourne.

Liz has 18 years of counselling experience, and has worked with adults, adolescents and children in individual and group settings. In addition to seeing private patients at **ER Psychology** located at the Humphries Road Medical Centre, Liz provides on-site psychological therapeutic care to children ranging in age from 5-11 years, at several Peninsula based primary schools.

Liz has worked with a range of presenting problems including health related concerns, chronic pain, depression, anxiety, stress; loss of confidence, poor self-esteem, adjustment disorders, grief and loss, and behavioural disorders.

Liz's approach to presenting problems is to examine the biological, psychological, and social components that underpin the issues presented by clients. She takes an integrative approach to counselling, and mainly uses client-centred, cognitive behavioural, and strength based therapies.

Liz has a strong interest in positive psychology, particularly the way in which individuals can learn to recognize and utilize their character strengths to overcome challenges.

In Grade One, we have just started learning about Division in our Maths lessons.


We are learning about sharing objects into equal groups and working out if we have any remainders/leftovers.






