### It's Disco Time

# **Tomorrow Night!**

The time has arrived for our first disco in about 5 years and we are super excited! Our junior disco Prep to Grade 2 is from 5.00—6.30pm and our senior disco Grades 3,4,5 & 6 is from 7.00— 8.30pm. To assist with the smooth running of this event and to ensure the safety and wellbeing of our students we ask the following:

- Students are to arrive at the double door entrance to the hall no earlier than 10 minutes prior to start time.
   Could children please bring a filled water bottle with them.
- At these doors parents are required to sign in their children in to the event with children only proceeding in to the hall. For security and supervision reasons parents (unless authorised helpers) will not be allowed to enter the hall/disco. If your child will be picked up by someone other than a parent please advise when signing them in.
- We then ask parents to leave the property promptly to free up parking spaces. Parking will be available on Jones Rd and in the staff carpark and gravel drive through off Mornington Tyabb Rd. Some parents may also choose to park on McLauren Drive and walk down the hill.
- Please arrive to pick up your child on time via the same entrance. Parents will sign their child out at the door and then enter the hall to collect their child. We then ask parents to exit through the other side of the hall via the hall side doors. Staff will be there to direct you.
- Please be on time to pick up your child. Thank you!



### School preparations for bushfire season



FIRE DANGER RATING

Each year, to prepare for bushfires and grassfires, schools and early childhood services complete a range of activities. The Department of Education runs an annual fire risk assessment of schools and early childhood services. They are allocated a category of risk (categories 0 to 4) and are published on the Bushfire At-Risk Register (BARR). All schools and early childhood services listed on the BARR and Category 4 list will also close when a Catastrophic fire danger rating day is forecast in their fire weather district.

When the Bureau of Meteorology provides public fire danger rating forecasts or fire weather warnings, they use fire weather district areas. In Victoria, there are 9 fire weather districts,

which are based on Local Government Area boundaries. Our school is in Central fire weather district. As part of preparing our school for the fire season, we have updated and completed our Emergency Management Plan and prioritised maintenance works that may assist in preparing for the threat of fire and cleared our facility's grounds and gutters.

#### What does this mean for our school?

Our school has been identified as being at risk of bushfire or grassfire and is a Category 3 school. Our school will close on a day forecasted as Catastrophic fire danger rating in Central fire district. We are on the BARR (Bushfire at Risk Register).

### What is the department's policy?

The department's Bushfire and Grassfire Preparedness Policy requires all schools and early childhood services on the BARR and the Category 4 list to close when a Catastrophic fire danger rating day is forecast in their fire weather district. All school bus routes which travel in or through a district with Catastrophic fire danger must also be cancelled.

### When will our school be closed due to Catastrophic fire danger?

Our school will close on a day forecasted as Catastrophic fire danger rating in central fire district. Closure of the school due to a forecast Catastrophic day will be confirmed on the day prior and we will provide you with advice before the end of the school day. Any information regarding potential or confirmed Catastrophic fire danger days will be communicated to you by SMS and via a Sentral Post.

Once confirmed, the decision to close will not change, even if the weather forecast changes. This is to avoid confusion and help your family plan alternative care arrangements for your child. It is also important to be aware that:

- No one will be on site on days where the school is closed due to a forecast Catastrophic day.
- Out-of-school-hours care will also be cancelled on these days.
- All bus routes that travel through the Catastrophic area will be cancelled.
- School camps will be cancelled if a Catastrophic fire danger rating day is forecast for fire weather district in which the camp is located, or if the travel involves passing through areas that have Catastrophic fire danger.

Families are encouraged to action their Bushfire Survival Plan on Catastrophic fire danger rating days. On such days, children should never be left at home alone or in the care of older children. For those of us living in a bushfire prone area, the Country Fire Authority (CFA) advises that when Catastrophic days are forecast, the safest option is to leave the night before or early on the morning of the Catastrophic day.

### What can families and the school community do to help us prepare?

- Ensure we have your current contact details, including your mobile phone numbers.
- Keep in touch with us by reading our newsletters, checking our website, by talking to your child's teacher or any other member of staff about our emergency management plan.]
- Make sure your family's bushfire survival plan is up-to-date and includes alternative care arrangements in the event that our school is closed due to a Catastrophic fire danger. Further information can be found on the CFA's website.
- Action your family's bushfire survival plan if your own triggers are met. Our school community may be spread out across many areas and some families may be at higher risk than others. Your family's safety is critical, so please let us know if you are actioning your bushfire survival plan and if your children will be absent on these days.
- If your child is old enough, talk to them about bushfires and your family's bushfire survival plan.

# Reading at TPS!

We love Reading here at Tyabb.

We read each day to build our reading stamina and each week we delve into learning a new reading skill. Here is snapshot of what we have been learning about in our reading sessions lately...

### Prep

In prep we are practising summarising the events that happen in a book we have read. We read with our teacher and then with a friend. After reading, we talk about what happened in the story. We love reading!

### Grade One

In Grade One we have been critiquing texts. We can explain if we like or don't like a book and why. We wrote book reviews and rated books out of 5 stars. If you are looking for a great book to read, you can ask us!

#### **Grade Two**

In Grade Two we have been summarising the books we have been reading. To help us summarise we use the strategy: somebody, wanted, to, but, so then

### **Grade Three**

We have been using books to search for information and to synthesise new information into our own words. We then used this information to teach someone else about a neighbouring country. We had a blast learning from each other!

### **Grade Four**

In Grade 4 we have been analysing persuasive texts. After reading a persuasive text we put our detective hats on and notice the authors use of language. We hunt for rule of three, strong opinions, emotive language and more!

### **Grade Five**

In Grade 5 we have been using Literature Circles in our reading lessons. In Literature Circles each student has chosen a book of interest, and as a group read and discuss the book taking turns in different roles. Students have worked on various reading skills such as summarising, making connections and developing vocabulary.

### **Grade Six**

In Grade 6 we have been enjoying reading a novel as part of a Literature Circle. All groups are close to the end of their books, so there are some rich, lively and enthusiastic discussions happening!


### **Physical Education**


