We would also like to acknowledge students whose entries were shortlisted for 2023. These show how difficult it was to choose just two! Great effort everyone!







We compared living things to non-living things, looked at the life cycles of humans and animals and planted beans so that we could observe their growth.



We have also been busy working on our narrative writing skills this term and planning in our Writer's Notebook. It has been so much fun!



The children in 2C had fun brainstorming ideas about what could be inside the box, such as money, jewels, puppies and even a baby.

There are so many aspiring writers in 2C. It has been wonderful to watch their passion for writing grow as the year has progressed.





As part of this inquiry unit, we began learning about animal adaptations and habitats. We had a fantastic guest speaker, Dr Andrew McLean, who spoke to us about his work with elephants and how they are trained. This inspired our class to do further research and discover more about elephants and other living things.
