ANNUAL REPORT

We are extremely pleased with our results but will continue to strive to make improvements to provide the best for our students.

ENROLMENT PROCESS / SCHOOL TOURS

This week we started our school tours for potential new preps and their parents for 2025 and have many dates available throughout the term. If you know of interested prep parents for 2025 please encourage them to ring the office to book a tour. They can also access further information on our website for the new statewide Foundation enrolment timeline and process that applies for children starting Foundation (Prep) in 2025.

For parents with prep siblings starting in 2025, we encourage you to enrol your children early this term to give us an indication of our enrolments for the new year. This really helps us to work out how many classes we will have for 2025. Enrolment forms are now available from the office.

OUR RECENT CURRICULUM DAY

During our Whole School Review of 2023 we celebrated our excellent results and looked for possible areas for improvement. While our writing results were very good, it was felt that we should revisit our assessment and teaching of this area to extend our students even further. To do this we are running several writing professional development sessions for our teachers.

On Tuesday the 12th March we had a staff professional development day. The focus for the day was on the 6+1 Traits of writing. It was an inspiring and thought provoking day. We learnt lots of new ways to share our love of writing with our students especially through the use of high quality literature to mentor and model good quality writing.

The 6+1 Traits of Writing outlines a set of characteristics which are inherent in high quality writing of all text types. Knowing and recognising the Traits supports teachers to analyse student drafts to plan meaningful and relevant lessons. The Traits assist educators to identify the skills and content students must acquire to develop proficiency as writers.

We will continue to take the children through the writing process (i.e. pre-write, first draft, revise, edit, and publish) and will now explicitly focus on the 6+1 traits using high quality mentor texts.

What are the 6+1 Traits?

- · Ideas—the meaning and development of the message
- Organisation—the internal structure of the piece
- Voice—the personal tone and flavour of the author's message
- Word Choice—the vocabulary a writer chooses to convey meaning
- Sentence Fluency—the rhythm and flow of the text
- Conventions—the mechanical correctness of the piece
- Presentation—the overall appearance of the author's work

HEADS UP WE ARE HAVING A CONCERT! THURSDAY 12TH SEPTEMBER

During our parent surveys last year parents were asked what we could do to improve and one of the suggestions was to go back to having a whole school production. Our Christmas concert was a huge success but to avoid the novelty of this wearing off we have decided to alternate between having a Christmas concert one year and a whole school production the next. This will be our year of the whole school production.



During term 3 children will have a STOMP dance lesson each Friday as they did during 2023. This time lessons will work towards a dance item that your child/children will perform as a part of a story told during the concert. The story will be told by selected senior school students who have auditioned for main parts. We are in the early stages of preparation and there will be more information to come but thought we should give you the heads up to save the date!!!



The first term went by so quickly and the Grade 1's have had an amazing start to the year.

They've been learning about the structure of narrative stories and have been writing their very own picture story books!

Curriculum Corner






Tyabb students are back for Term 2 and are ADDING more knowledge about Maths! Students and teachers are really enjoying playing Maths Games to improve their fluency and doing rich learning tasks. Here are some grades showing some of the Mathematical learning that they have been doing over the past few weeks.



GRADE 2

Addition is the theme of the week where our grade 2 students have been using doubles and doubles plus one. They have learned which words mean adding and which words mean taking away. Get ready for a lot of



different strategies at home, including jump strategy, split strategy and building to the nearest 10.

GRADE 3

Grade 3's have been looking at a variety of strategies for solving addition problems in many different contexts. They find complementary numbers to make 100 using MAB such as 52 and 48. After counting collections of coins, they can work out how

much change to the nearest dollar and can regroup numbers to make addition easier!

GRADE 4

Our brilliant grade 4 students have been learning different strategies for multiplication facts like doubling and shifting place value. They recently did a rich learning task where they had to find a variety of right angles and acute angles

on a clock. In the next few weeks they will work on time related problems and efficient addition strategies.

GRADE 5

We are in multiplication mode in grade 5! Students have been learning

multiplication facts as well as different written methods for multiplying very large numbers including the box method, lattice method and vertical method. Just ask these legends how to do it and they will show you!

GRADE 6

The grade 6 leaders have been playing a new game called Multo. It's just like Bingo but using multiplication facts.

They've discovered that some numbers show up more than others! For example 24 could be 8x3 2x12 or 6x4. That's a great number to have on your board. 81 isn't as good because you can only get it one way!

GRADE PREP

Our wonderful prep students are learning lots every week. They have been focusing on making patterns in many different ways, just like the photo above. They have also been focusing on using numbers in patterns and are practising to count by 2s, 5s and 10s.



GRADE 1

Students in grade 1 are counting champions! Their addition unit is coming up and they have been practising by playing one of their favourite games called Race to 100. Here are some photos of them in action!
