SCHOOL SAVING BONUS

You may have seen the recent announcement of the School Saving Bonus, as part of the Victorian Budget 2024/25. This one-off support will include \$400 for each eligible student to help families cover the costs of school uniforms and activities in 2025. It will be available to parents and carers of every child enrolled in a Victorian government school in 2025.

Cash will not be paid directly to individuals or families. Instead, families will receive the bonus as credits on their school accounts that will help meet the costs of your children's activities and uniforms. There will be more information and guidance about the School Saving Bonus in Term 3, 2024, ahead of its implementation in 2025.

NATIONAL RECONCILIATION WEEK 27TH MAY–3RD JUNE

National Reconciliation Week (NRW) is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia.

The theme for National Reconciliation Week 2024, **Now More Than Ever**, is a reminder to all of us that no matter what, the fight for justice and the rights of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people will —and must —continue.

Now more than ever, the work continues. In treaty making, in truth-telling, in understanding our history, in education, and in tackling racism. We need connection. We need respect. We need action. And we need change. Now more than ever, we need reconciliation.

What's the significance of 27 May and 3 June?

27th May marks the anniversary of the 1967 referendum when Australians voted to remove clauses in the Australian Constitution that discriminated against Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. 3rd June marks the historic 1992 Mabo decision in which the High Court of Australia recognised native title—the recognition that Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples' rights over their lands did survive British colonisation. The day before National Reconciliation Week, 26th May, is National Sorry Day, which was first held in Sydney in 1998 and is now commemorated nationally to remember and honour the Stolen Generations.

During National Reconciliation Week each of our classes will be learning about the history and cultures of our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. We will share some of the work we have been doing in our following newsletters.

EDUCATION WEEK




This week was Education Week with a spotlight on STEM and the importance of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) in our everyday lives.

During the week children participate in many activities that celebrate this year's theme. Our preps built a toy and graphed the number of coloured cubes to make it.



Our grade 1's made paper towers with the challenge to build the tallest free standing tower they could! The students gathered their construction team and collected some materials. We needed some sticky tape, scissors and something to measure how tall our finished tower was. The grade 1s explored mathematical concepts and language such as shape, height, vertical and measurement. Lots of great learning and fun in grade 1!

Our grade 2's made 2D and 3D shapes using modelling clay and toothpicks - they also made spaghetti towers.



The grade 3's and 4s did a STEM session with teachers and students from Westernport Secondary College which was a science experiment to create a rainbow of colours. The grade 4's also did a M.A.T.H Mummy Mayhem in Minecraft Education. It involved solving 10 shape / geometry based problems / riddles within a world of Minecraft.













Thank you to staff and students from Westernport Secondary College for running STEM classes for our students in grade 3 & 4. Our kid had lots of fun!! The grade 5's did a bridge building challenge. Students were posed with the challenge of building a bridge to span 50cm that would successfully hold a matchbox toy car. We explored beam, arch, suspension & cantilever designs. Students designed and built on Wednesday. Thursday we hope to test the bridges. Most students have gone with a beam, arch or suspension design as we all agree that cantilever would be over engineering for our purpose.











During Education Week, year 6 students engaged in Minecraft Education tasks in which they applied their mathematic and technology skills. They participated in an engineering task which involved creating a pair of shoes out of newspaper. Students were critiqued on the style, comfort and durability of their shoes.

Thank you to all of the families that attended our open night. It was terrific to see the smiling faces of our children as they showed off their special work and classrooms to their parents.

Thank you to Mr Davies and Ms Grinsted for organising and running a sausage sizzle to raise funds for our school and give our parents and children an easy dinner for the night!!!!

Attitude to School Survey—2024

Each parent of students in years 4, 5, 6 will receive a letter shortly outlining this survey further. Please keep an <u>eye out for this letter.</u>

How is my child's confidentiality protected?

Your child will be provided with a unique login to complete the survey from their teacher. The student login is an assigned identifier that may be used to link data for statistical and research purposes only. Personally identifiable data will not be recorded in the survey response file to ensure the confidentiality of your child's responses is protected at all times.

How will results be reported?

The survey results will be reported back to the school in aggregate form throughout the survey period. All survey data that is made available in reports are for groups of students only so that no individual student can be identified. Data suppression rules are used for schools with low student numbers per year level.

Your school may share the results of the survey with parents, in documents such as the School Annual Report.

Options for participation

Participation in this survey is **voluntary**. If you **do not** wish for your child to do the survey, please opt out via email to your school: kristine.grinsted@education.vic.gov.au. Please do so before **Monday 24th May 2024**, stating that you wish to opt out of your child's participation, along with their name and year level.

If your school does not receive a Refusal of Consent email from yourself before the survey commencement date mentioned within this letter, it means that you give your consent for your child to participate in the 2024. Attitudes to School Survey.

A copy of the survey that we are asking your child to complete is available from your child's school. Please contact the administration office if you would like to see the survey before making your decision about whether you would like your child to participate.


Reading @ Tyabb Ps






