EDUCATION WEEK

Education Week runs the week after our open night from 19th-23rd May. This year's theme is 'Celebration of Cultures' to highlight the diversity of our communities and the importance of every child feeling safe and welcome at school. During this week the children will participate in several activities that celebrate this year's theme including:

- Classrooms will run a variety of hands on cultural activities.
- We will have an informal dress up day (no parade) with children being asked to dress or bring something from their own country or country of choice eg item, photograph, book, some food to taste/share.
- There will be a multiage day with children mixing with other year levels to visit a different teacher for a story and activity about cultural inclusion.

Our School Captains, Lochlan and Kiahna, did a reading and our JSC Captains, Finn and Ruthie, laid a wreath on behalf of Tyabb Primary School to show our respect for the men and women who served in the First World War and subsequent wars. Thank you to Ms Grinsted, our captains and to other members of the community who also attended an Anzac Day service.



ATTITUDES TO SCHOOL SURVEY YEARS 4–6

The AtoSS is a voluntary annual student survey offered by the Department of Education to assist schools and the department to gain an understanding of students' perceptions and experience of school. We value student voice as a means to improving student engagement, wellbeing and quality instruction and will be asking students in years 4-6 their thoughts and feelings in relation to their school, their learning, peer relationships, resilience, bullying, health and wellbeing, physical activity, and life in general.

A note will be coming home soon to the parents of year 4-6 students with further information about the survey and information for parents if they do not want their child to participate. Student participation in the survey is voluntary and parents may opt out if they do not want their child to participate.

BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS UPDATE


As a school we are committed to, not only the continuous improvement of our educational programs, resources and teaching practices, but also to enhancing and improving our school grounds. Over the holidays we had the following works done:

- Continued building of our new ramps
- New steel roofing to under cover ways
- New black fencing around our school oval
- Installation of a spoon drain on our oval, ready for new drainage and resurfacing of our oval in term 3.

During term 2 & 3 we will be focusing on the following grounds works:

- Drainage and resurfacing of our school oval
- Installation of new artificial grass on our basketball court at the front of our school
- New seating around the basketball court at the front of the school
- Repairs to paving around the hall
- Repairs and new lino in several classrooms rooms 1-8
- Refurbishment of our school office and recarpeting of our administration block

Fundraising for 2025 will potentially be going towards a steel roof over our blue concrete basketball court. This will be dependent on the overall costs of this project.



- Go to https://order.arphotos.com.au and enter the 2025 image code for your child (from their personalized flyer)
- Tap on 'Add another child' to enter the image codes of any siblings
- Fill in your email and mobile details and then review all details before confirming your registration

Even if you registered last year, it's important that you do it again each year using your child's new image code to link their photos for the current year with your contact details.


To ensure you are ordering school photos for the current year, please wait for notifications that 2025 images are online before placing orders.


In the webshop you can view photos and customize your photo package; Choose ANY layout, ANY image and purchase multiple digital image downloads.
