

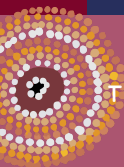

As a result of protected industrial action being undertaken by members of the Australian Education Union, full written comments may not be included in this report. Reports still meet the national and state requirements without written comments. Parents/Carers will have the opportunity to seek feedback regarding their child's accomplishments, progress and future learning goals during Student Led Conferences in Term 3. Families are also welcome to contact their child's teacher should they wish to discuss their child's learning in more detail.

Parking and Road Safety

We have recently seen an increase in parents parking/waiting illegally in NO STOPPING ZONES and on Jones Road. These restrictions are in place to keep our children, families and community safe. By doing the right thing also reduces aggressive phone calls that are being received by the administration team.



Please remember and adhere to:

- . Do not stop and wait in the middle of Jones Road for a parking space. If no space is available, continue along the road and return when a space becomes available.
- . Obey all parking restrictions and signage, including NO STOPPING zones. Parents should not park opposite the school and cross the road, as this creates a significant safety risk.
- . Disabled parking spaces may only be used by vehicles displaying a valid disability parking permit. Fines apply for illegal use.
- . Observe the 5-minute parking zone at the front of the school between 3:30 pm and 4:00 pm to help traffic flow safely and efficiently.

The safety of our children is our priority. Police and parking inspectors have recently been monitoring the area and fines have been issued for non-compliance.

Please play your role in protecting everyone. Thank you to the many families who do the right thing and help keep our school community safe.

Are you able to volunteer at our school canteen once a term?

As of term 3, there will be changes to the times required for volunteers. The new times will be as follows:

Tuesday 9.00am – 10.00am

Wednesday 1.00pm – 2.30pm

Friday 1.15pm – 2.30pm

TUESDAY MORNING: This shift involves putting stickers on bags and some basic food prep.

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON: This fast-paced shift involves handing out lunch order tubs and serving children icy poles and snacks at lunchtime.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON: This shift involves opening the canteen at lunchtime for icy poles from 1.30pm until 2.15pm. It is recommended that you arrive at the canteen at approximately 1.15pm to set up. You will work along with 2 grade 6 students. Further instructions are on the fridge in the canteen.

All volunteers receive a \$5 voucher to go towards their child's lunch order.

Term 1

All classes started the year refreshing their sign skills after a 6 month break by revising colours, how to describe themselves and others appearances. This year weekly fingerspell challenges were introduced and most students have developed improved confidence with all aspects of fingerspelling. Students learnt the sign skills to be able to play 'Guess Who?' completely in Auslan. See below some photos of 5B enjoying this sign and game experience.

Term 2 saw grades 3 and 4 sign about their likes and dislikes. Then expand their signing skills from their personal worlds to their school community. We focused on school signs in terms of subjects, people and buildings and students worked towards a video project where they had to sign an assembly report posing as a year 6 captain. In grades 5 and 6 students learnt more about the wider community, expanding their skills with general greetings, money and shopping signs. Year 5 and 6 classes worked towards a video project featuring a signed market stall shopping conversation. One student was a market stall seller and the other a buyer. Students invented what they sold, the price and how many items the buyer bought. Many partners developed small props or brought in examples of their wares. The year 3-6 video projects have been fun to review and I am so proud of every student's efforts! See photos of 3B rehearsing and recording their video projects. Well done!

Next term I look forward to meeting our Foundation students, and this years grade 1, 2 and 3A classes, who all move to having Auslan in semester 2. We will develop or further our Auslan skills through fun games and many 'hands on' sign activities.

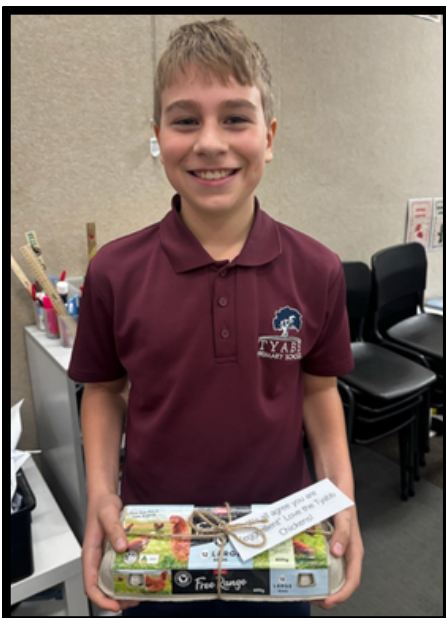

- Some one that will clean out their home and replensih their gum leaves weekly

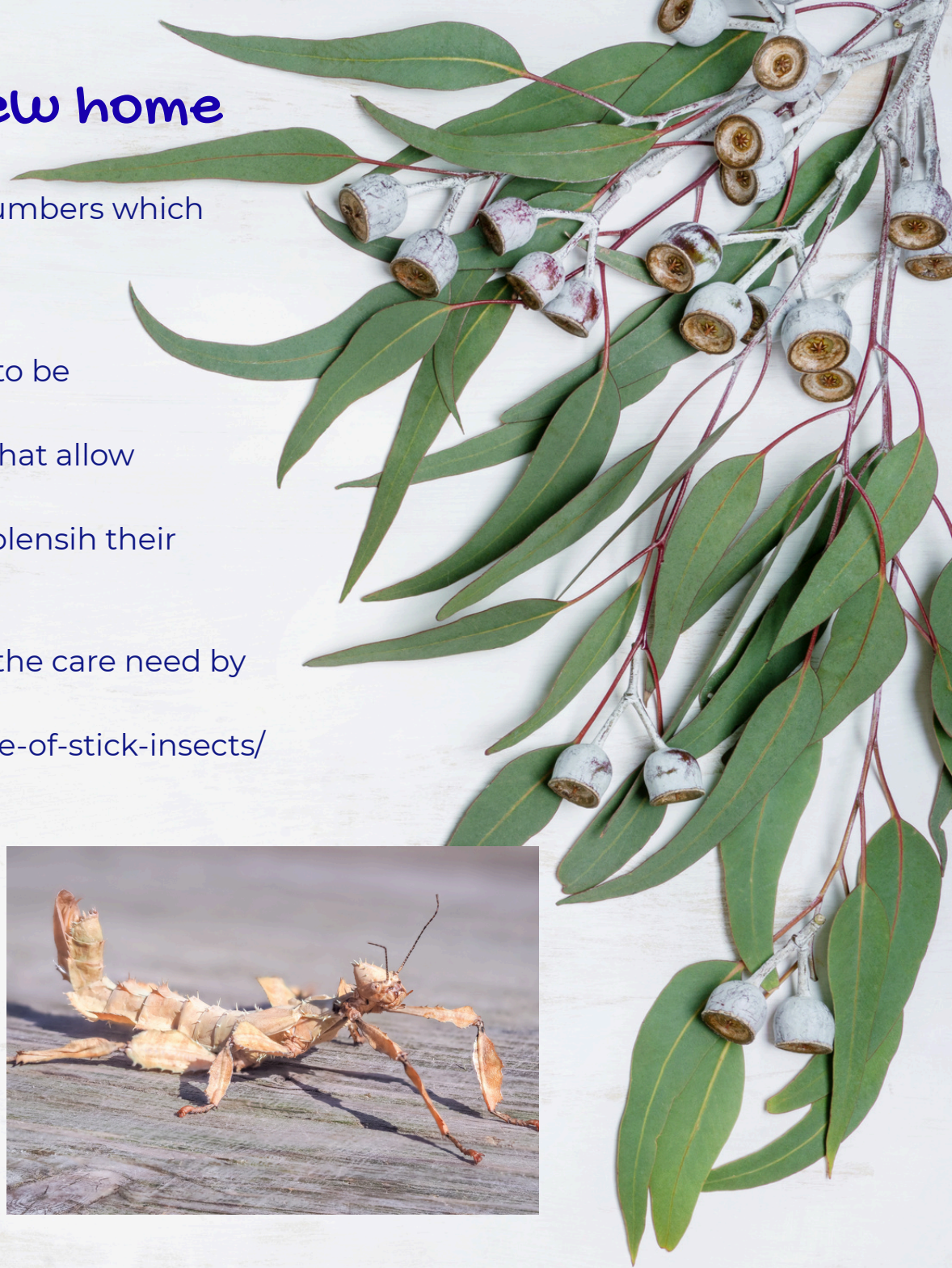
