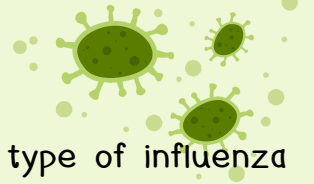

GET READY FOR FLU SEASON

As the weather cools down it might feel like everyone around you is catching a cold or the flu. There are ways to minimise your risk.



What is the flu?

The flu – also known as influenza – is a respiratory illness caused by a type of influenza virus. It is very contagious, spreading easily from one person to another. In most cases, the flu has symptoms similar to a cold. However, tiredness, lethargy and high fevers are more prominent, and the illness tends to last longer. The flu can lead to more serious sickness and complications – especially in very young children and those with ongoing medical conditions.

The flu is more common in autumn and winter. Each year, flu viruses change, and so do the types of flu spreading in the community. Occasionally, one of these strains can cause a more widespread or serious outbreak.



Signs and symptoms of the flu

The flu usually starts with a sudden fever and many of the following symptoms:

Sore throat – Runny nose – Dry cough – Headache – Aches and pains –
Tiredness and lethargy – Nausea, vomiting and/or diarrhoea.

How to care for the flu at home

Most children can safely recover from the flu at home within a week. The best things you can do to help your child are:

Ensure they get plenty of rest

Encourage them to drink enough fluids

Give them paracetamol or ibuprofen for any pain or discomfort. Do not give aspirin to your child.

As the flu is a virus, antibiotics cannot treat it. A doctor may only prescribe antibiotics if your child has another infection caused by bacteria, such as a chest or ear infection.

Sometimes, a doctor may prescribe antiviral medicines to children with chronic medical conditions or severe flu symptoms.

Watch your child for any signs they are getting sicker, such as:

not eating or drinking enough

dehydration, with symptoms like cold hands and feet, sunken eyes, urinating (peeing) less often
trouble breathing

worsening tiredness and lethargy

acting extremely irritable.

See a doctor or health professional if your child's condition gets worse.

On Wednesday 27th May, Grade 3A visited the Royal Botanic Gardens Cranbourne as part of our Inquiry unit, History - How are celebrations, culture, community and remembrance important?.

Students explored the concept of Shared Country and learnt about the Boon Wurrung people's connection to Country and the environment.



Throughout the day, students learnt about Aboriginal tools, made ochre, explored Aboriginal symbols, tasted lemon myrtle tea and discovered how plants were traditionally used for food, medicine, fibre and tools. They also enjoyed time playing on the playground.

The excursion was a wonderful opportunity for students to deepen their understanding of Aboriginal culture through engaging, hands-on learning experiences.

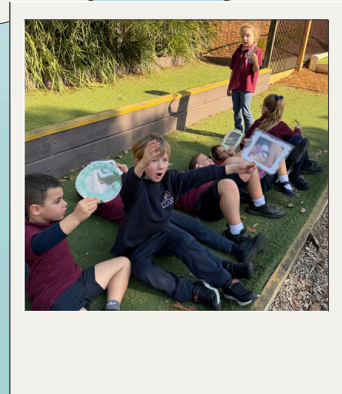

Our Year 1 and 2 students have been studying sources and uses of water while remembering that it is a precious resource.



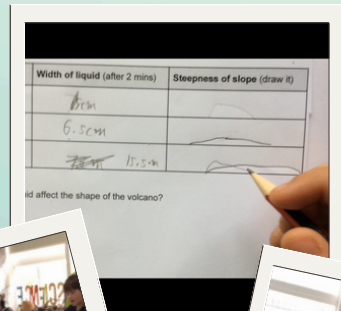
